**COMMISSION STAFF'S FOURTH RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE
COMPLETENESS OF APPLICATION AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 7, files this Fourth Recommendation on Administrative Completeness of Application and proposed Procedural Schedule. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On September 27, 2018, City of Edinburg (Edinburg), filed an application to amend water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12106 to incorporate areas it currently serves and decertify a portion of North Alamo Water Supply Corporation's water service area in Hidalgo County. The requested service area consists of 218.71 acres. Supplemental information was filed on March 26, 2019.

On April 29, 2019, Order No. 7 was issued establishing a deadline of May 28, 2019 for Edinburg to cure deficiencies and a deadline for Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on June 27, 2019. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that Edinburg's application continue to be found to be administratively incomplete. Staff's memorandum filed on April 26, 2019 outlined mapping deficiencies with the application. No response to cure these deficiencies was filed. Staff recommends that Edinburg be given a deadline of July 26, 2019 to cure the deficiencies noted in Staff's April 26, 2019 filing and that Staff be given a deadline of August 26, 2019, to file a supplemental recommendation on the

administrative completeness of the application. If no response is filed, Staff recommends dismissal of the proceeding pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code § 22.181(6) & (7).

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete at this time and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.


