## ORDER NO. 15 FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT; AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses Commission Staff's May 26, 2020 recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the City of Edinburg's application. Commission Staff recommends that the administrative law judge (ALJ) find the application deficient and provide the City of Edinburg an opportunity to cure the deficiencies described in the recommendation.

The ALJ finds the application incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

By June 25, 2020, the City of Edinburg must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies described in Patricia Garcia's memorandum filed on May 26, 2020. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The ALJ takes official notice that on the same day Commission Staff's recommendation was filed, the City of Edinburg filed supplemental information. The City of Edinburg must not issue notice until the application is administratively complete.

By July 27, 2020, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.

The ALJ will be receptive to a motion to dismiss if Commission Staff believes that the application remains deficient.
