#### NOTICE OF APPROVAL

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This Notice addresses the petition of Charmaine Mirander Wilke to amend Tri-Comunity Water Supply Corporation's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10313 by expedited release. The Commission approves Ms. Wilke's petition and decertifies approximately 77 acres from Tri-Community WSC's CCN.

The Commission adopts the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

#### I. Findings of Fact

#### **Petitioner**

1. Ms. Wilke owns a tract of land in Guadalupe County that is approximately 150 acres; 77 acres of her 150-acre tract are located within the boundaries of Tri-Community WSC's CCN number 10313.

#### Petition

- 2. On October 2, 2018, Ms. Wilke filed a petition for the expedited release of her 150-acre tract in Guadalupe County.
- 3. Guadalupe County is adjacent to Bexar County, which is a county with a population of over 1,000,000.
- 4. Ms. Wilke stated that she is the sole owner of the 150-acre tract and that it is more than 25 contiguous acres, not receiving water service, and located entirely within Guadalupe County.
- 5. Ms. Wilke provided warranty deeds confirming her ownership of the tract and also location maps.

- 6. On October 15, 2018, Ms. Wilke filed supplemental information to clarify that she is seeking the expedited release of any part of her 150-acre tract that is located within Tri Community WSC's CCN number 10313.
- 7. In Order No. 3 issued on November 12, 2018, the administrative law judge (ALJ) found Ms. Wilke's amended petition administratively complete.

#### Notice

- 8. Ms. Wilke attested that a copy of the petition had been sent by certified mail to the current CCN holder the same day of the filing of the petition.
- 9. Notice of the amended petition appeared in the October 26, 2018 issue of the *Texas Register*.
- 10. The Commission provided a copy of the notice filed with the *Texas Register* to Tri-Community WSC at its address of record:

11. In Order No. 3 issued on November 12, 2018, the ALJ found the notice sufficient.

#### Water Service

- 12. There is no evidence that Tri-Community WSC has committed or dedicated facilities or lines providing water service to the tract of land.
- 13. There is no evidence that Tri-Community WSC has performed acts or supplied anything to the tract of land.
- 14. Tri-Community WSC has not committed facilities or lines providing water service to the tract of land.
- 15. Tri-Community WSC has not performed acts or supplied anything to the tract of land.
- 16. The tract of land is not receiving actual water service from Tri-Community WSC.

#### Determination of Useless or Valueless Property

17. Tri-Community WSC did not identify any property that is rendered useless or valueless by the decertification.

#### **Informal Disposition**

- 18. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice in this proceeding.
- 19. Commission Staff and Ms. Wilke are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 20. No parties filed protests, motions to intervene, or requested a hearing.
- 21. This decision is not adverse to any party.
- 22. On November 26, 2018, Commission Staff recommended approval of the petition.

#### II. Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this petition under Texas Water Code (TWC) §13.254(a-5).
- 2. To obtain a release under TWC § 13.254(a-5), a landowner must demonstrate that the landowner owns a tract of land that is at least 25 acres, that the tract of land is located in a qualifying county, and that the tract of land is not receiving water service.
- 3. Guadalupe County is a qualifying county under TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245.
- 4. Notice of the petition was provided in compliance with 16 TAC § 24.245(*l*)(4)(A)(vi) and 16 TAC §§ 22.54.
- 5. The tract of land is not receiving water service from Tri-Community WSC, as that term has been defined by the Austin Court of Appeals, in accordance with TWC § 13.254(a-5).
- 6. No property has been rendered useless or valueless by the decertification; therefore, under TWC § 13.254(d) through (g), no compensation is owed to Tri-Community WSC.
- 7. Because no compensation is owed under TWC § 13.254(d) through (g), a retail public utility may render retail water service directly or indirectly to the public in the decertified area without providing compensation to Tri-Community WSC.

- 8. Ms. Wilke has sufficiently satisfied the requirements of TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 TAC § 24.245 by adequately demonstrating ownership of a tract of land that is at least 25 contiguous acres, located in a qualifying county, and not receiving water service.
- 9. The Commission processed the petition in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act,<sup>2</sup> the TWC, and Commission rules.
- 10. Under TWC § 13.257(r) and (s), Tri-Community WSC is required to record a map and a certified copy of the approved certificate, and any amendment thereof, along with a boundary description of the service area, in the real property records of each county in which the service area or a portion of the service area is located, and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording.
- 11. The requirements for informal disposition in 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

#### III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following orders:

- 1. The Commission approves the petition and removes approximately 77 acres from Tri-Community WSC's water CCN number 10313.
- 2. The Commission amends Tri-Community WSC's CCN number 10313 in accordance with this Notice.
- 3. The Commission's official service area boundary maps for Tri-Community WSC will reflect this change, as provided in the attached map.
- 4. Tri-Community WSC must comply with the recording requirements of TWC § 13.257(r) and (s) for the area in Guadalupe County affected by the petition and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 31 days after receipt of this Notice.
- 5. The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted.


