COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS, NOTICE, AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files Staff's Recommendation on Administrative Completeness, Notice, and Proposed Procedural Schedule, in response to Order No. 1. Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On October 9, 2018, the City of Marshall (Applicant) filed an application to amend water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 11064 in Harrison County. Applicant proposes to amend its CCN to include its current customer base and extend its services outside its city limits. The requested service area consists of approximately 15,127 acres and 1,124 current customers.

On October 15, 2018, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of November 8, 2018 for Staff to file a recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application, the sufficiency of the proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Kathryn Eiland in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application filed by Applicant and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.

III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Applicant be directed to use the attached notice forms to publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Harrison County, and to:

- 1) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ's web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/
- 2) File in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

IV. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Event	Date
Deadline for Applicant to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	January 2, 2019
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	Within 10 days of Applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Applicant be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.

On October 9, 2018, the City of Marshall (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11064 in Harrison County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237 (formerly §§ 24.101 to 24.107).

Based on Staff's review of the above referenced application, Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and be found administratively complete. Staff also recommends the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
 - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
 - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located; and
 - e) any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area; and
 - f) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Harrison County.

- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/.
- 4) File in the docket an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that the notice was provided. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notice and affidavit to meet these requirements.

Please note, Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to the Applicant. The Applicant will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond unless a different response period is ordered by the presiding officer.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land.

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
