COMMISSION STAFF'S AMENDED PETITION TO REVOKE KLEIMANN ESTATES WATERWORKS'S CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY AND NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR A HEARING

Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) files this Amended Petition to Revoke Kleimann Estates Waterworks' Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (Amended Petition) and hereby provides notice of the opportunity to request a hearing on the merits of this Amended Petition.

I. INTRODUCTION

For the reasons discussed below, the water service Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12156 for Kleimann Estates Waterworks (Kleimann) should be revoked. Upon investigation, Commission Staff has determined that the public water system associated with Kleimann is inactive, and that the CCN should be revoked.

In the event Kleimann fails to request a hearing within thirty days of service of this Amended Petition, a default order should be issued, without additional notice to Kleimann, granting all relief sought in this Amended Petition. In support of this Amended Petition, Commission Staff respectfully shows the following:

II. JURISDICTION AND LEGAL AUTHORITY

The Commission is authorized to regulate and supervise the business of each water and sewer utility within its jurisdiction. Pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 13.242 (TWC), a "water supply or sewer service corporation may not in any way render retail water or sewer utility service directly

or indirectly to the public without first having obtained from the utility commission a certificate that the present or future public convenience and necessity will require that installation, operation, or extension."

A CCN is defined as "[a] permit issued by the commission which authorizes and obligates a retail public utility to furnish, make available, render, or extend continuous and adequate retail water or sewer service to a specified geographic area." A retail public utility is "[a]ny person corporation, public utility, water supply or sewer service corporation, municipality, political subdivision or agency operating, maintaining, or controlling in this state facilities for providing potable water service or sewer service, or both, for compensation."

A retail public utility that possesses a CCN is required to provide continuous and adequate service.⁴ A retail public utility that possesses a CCN and fails to provide continuous and adequate service may be subject to revocation.⁵ As part of this authority, the Commission, "after notice and hearing, may revoke or amend any" CCN if the Commission finds that the certificate holder "has never provided, is no longer providing, is incapable of providing, or has failed to provide continuous and adequate service" in the area, or part of the area, covered by the certificate.⁶

Pursuant to the contested case provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act,⁷ a party is entitled to an opportunity for a hearing after reasonable notice of not less than 10 days, where the party may respond to and present evidence and argument on each issue involved in the case.⁸ If a hearing is not requested within thirty days after service of notice of an opportunity for hearing, a default occurs.⁹ Upon default, the presiding officer may issue a default order, revoking the certificate without a hearing on an informal basis.¹⁰

III. FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

Kleimann is located in Montgomery County, Texas in the City of Willis. On February 17, 1978, Carl Kleimann filed an application with the Secretary of State to create a Texas corporation

known as Kleimann Estates, Inc. On January 20, 1987, Kleimann Estates, Inc. ceased to exist. On April 5, 1989, Betty Gregurek filed an application with the Secretary of State to create a Texas corporation known as Kleimann Estates Water Co., Inc. Kleimann Estates Water Co., Inc. underwent a tax forfeiture on August 30, 2002, and was reinstated on November 7, 2003. Subsequently, on September 18, 2009, articles of dissolution were filed.

On June 21, 1989, Kleimann was granted CNN No. 12156. At this stage, it remains unclear as to what legal entity the CCN was granted. The registered agent for Kleimann Estates, Inc. was located at 302 Stewart St. in Willis, TX, while Kleimann is located at 305 Stewart St., indicating some connection. However, the CCN was granted more than two years after that entity ceased to legally exist. Kleimann Estates Water Co., Inc. has nearly the same name as the utility, is located in Willis, TX, and was in existence at the time of the granting of the CCN. In the interest of ensuring notice to all relevant parties, Commission Staff intends to provide notice to both entities.

Commission Staff's review of Commission's records indicate that neither Kleimann Estates, Inc. nor Kleimann Estates Water Co., Inc. is in business and the facilities Kleimann used to provide continuous and adequate service are inactive. Therefore, Kleimann is no longer providing and is incapable of providing continuous and adequate service.

IV. RECOMMENDATION FOR REVOCATION

The Commission should revoke Kleimann's CCN No. 12156 because Kleimann is no longer in business, and the facilities it used to provide continuous and adequate service are inactive. ¹¹ As long as CCN No. 12156 continues to remain in effect, it may be a violation of Commission rules for another company to provide service in the certificated area. ¹²

For the above stated reasons, Commission Staff recommends revocation of CCN No. 12156 pursuant to TWC § 13.254(a)(1) and 16 TAC § 24.245(i)(1)(A).

V. NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

16 TAC §§ 22.54 and 22.55 require Commission Staff to provide reasonable notice to persons affected by a proceeding in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. In license revocation proceedings, APA § 2001.054 requires that notice be given "by personal service or by

registered or certified mail to the license holder of facts or conduct alleged to warrant the intended action." In order to proceed on a default basis, 16 TAC § 22.183 requires Commission Staff to provide notice by certified mail, return receipt requested: (a) to a certificate holder's last known address in the Commission's records; (b) to the person's registered agent for process on file with the Secretary of State; or (3) to an address for the party identified after reasonable investigation if the first two options are not applicable.

In accordance with these provisions, Commission Staff will provide a copy of this Amended Petition by certified mail, return receipt requested, to Kleimann's last known addresses in the TCEQ's and Commission's records:

Pursuant to 16 TAC § 22.183, Commission Staff hereby notifies Kleimann that the factual allegations in this Amended Petition could be deemed admitted and the relief sought herein granted by default if Kleimann fails to request a hearing within 30 days after service of the Amended Petition and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing. The purpose of a hearing on the merits is to consider revocation of Kleimann's CCN No. 12156. If Kleimann fails to request a hearing, the

presiding officer may issue a default order on an informal basis without a hearing on the merits pursuant to APA § 2001.056(4) and 16 TAC § 22.183.

The factual allegations listed in Commission Staff's Amended Petition and Notice of Opportunity for a Hearing could be deemed admitted and the relief sought herein could be granted by default if you fail to timely request a hearing.

VI. REQUEST

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Commission Staff respectfully requests that the Commission grants Commission Staff's Amended Petition to revoke Kleimann's CCN No. 12156. In the event that Kleimann fails to request a hearing on the merits, Commission Staff requests that the Commission issue a default final order, with no further notice to Kleimann, revoking CCN No. 12156.


