ORDER NO. 1 REQUIRING RESPONSES AND ADDRESSING OTHER PROCEDURAL MATTERS

I. Petition

This Order addresses the January 28, 2019, petition of LV Realty Investments LLC appealing the decision of G&W Water Supply Corporation regarding the cost of obtaining service.

II. Requiring Comments on the Administrative Completeness of the Petition

On or before February 27, 2019, Commission Staff must file comments on the administrative completeness of the petition.

III. Requesting Procedural Schedule

By February 27, 2019, LV Realty Investments, G&W WSC, and Commission Staff must file recommendations regarding how to proceed with the petition and propose a procedural schedule.

IV. Filing Requirements

Unless otherwise specified, an original and ten copies of documents relating to this proceeding must be filed with the Commission's Filing Clerk in accordance with 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.71. A copy of each document filed with the Commission must also be served on all parties as required by 16 TAC § 22.74. All filings can be accessed on the PUC Interchange webpage at, http://interchange.puc.texas.gov.

Responsive pleadings are governed by 16 TAC § 22.78. Unless otherwise specified, responses or replies to any motion or other pleading must be filed within five working days after the date on which the motion or other pleading was received by the responding party. The Commission will consider a failure to file a timely response as agreement to the relief requested.

All parties must provide their current addresses, telephone and facsimile numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party must provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, telephone, and facsimile information if such information changes. The telephone and facsimile numbers will be placed on the service list for the convenience of the parties. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

V. Ex Parte Communications

Ex parte communications with the administrative law judges and presiding officer (collectively, ALJs) are prohibited per 16 TAC § 22.3(b)(2). Parties must communicate with the ALJ only through written documents filed with the Commission's Filing Clerk and served on all parties. Questions concerning this Order or any other order must be submitted in writing, filed with the Commission, and served on all parties of record.
