COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the petition be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On February 7, 2019, Valley Ranch Municipal Utility District No. 1 (Valley Ranch MUD 1), filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) for a new sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) and to decertify a portion of Porter Municipal Utility District's CCN number 20573 in Montgomery County pursuant to Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.254(a-5) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(l).

Valley Ranch MUD 1 is already providing retail sewer service to the requested area within its boundaries, which is currently certificated to Porter MUD. Valley Ranch MUD 1 has received two requests for service from the Signorelli Company for property outside the district owned by Signorelli Company. In response to Order No. 1, issued on February 20, 2019, Valley Ranch MUD 1 filed a supplement to the application on March 4, 2019.

Order No. 1 also required Staff to file a recommendation on administrative completeness and proposed notice by March 7, 2019. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. APPLICATION SUFFICIENCY RECOMMENDATION

As detailed in the attached memorandum of Greg Charles in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and Valley Ranch MUD 1's supplemental information, and determined that it is sufficient. Therefore, Staff recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete and accepted for filing

III. PROPOSED NOTICE

Staff has included notice for Valley Ranch MUD 1 to provide that meets the requirements of 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.235. Pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.235(a)(4), Valley Ranch MUD 1 should include a map with each notice, except for publication of notice, showing the proposed service area to be serviced.

Staff recommends that Valley Ranch MUD 1 be directed to provide the attached notice to any cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles of the outer boundary of the requested area to be serviced. As required by 16 TAC § 24.235(b)(1), Staff also recommends that Valley Ranch MUD 1 provide notice to the county judge of each county wholly or partially included within the requested area, and each groundwater conservation district wholly or partially included within the proposed area. The attached memorandum includes a non-exhaustive list of entities to whom Valley Ranch MUD 1 should issue notice. Additionally, Staff recommends that Valley Ranch MUD 1 publish approved notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Montgomery County, as required by 16 TAC § 24.235(c).

After Valley Ranch MUD 1 has completed issuance of such notice and in accordance with 16 TAC § 24.235(b) and (c), Staff recommends that Valley Ranch MUD 1 file within 30 days of the latest date of notice a copy of the actual notice sent, including attachments. Valley Ranch MUD 1 should include with its notice filing the attached affidavits, completed and signed, affirming that such notice was issued and listing each entity and person to whom notice was issued.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's administrative completeness recommendation, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends that Valley Ranch MUD 1's application be deemed administratively complete, their notice be found sufficient, and the proposed procedural schedule be adopted.

Municipal Utility District's Sewer Service Area in Montgomery County

On February 7, 2019, Valley Ranch Municipal Utility District (MUD) No. 1 filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to obtain a sewer CCN and to decertify a portion of Porter MUD's sewer service area in Montgomery County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Staff has reviewed the information filed by the Applicant, and recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b) The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
 - d) Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area; and
 - e) Publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Montgomery County.

Valley Ranch Municipal Utility District No. 1 has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to obtain a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) to provide retail sewer utility service, and to decertify a portion of Porter MUD's CCN No. 20573 in Montgomery County.

The requested area is located approximately 1 mile northwest of downtown Porter, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by Texas 99; on the east by US 59; on the south by FM 1314; and on the west by White Oak Drive and Valley Ranch Parkway. The total requested area includes approximately 830 acres and 943 current customers.

The requested area overlaps the boundaries of the Porter MUD. If Porter MUD does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that the district is consenting to Valley Ranch MUD's request to provide retail sewer utility service in the requested area.
