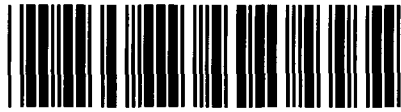

**ORDER NO. 7
FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT,
AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

This Order addresses the amended application, filed on March 11, 2019, of Texas Water Systems, Inc. and Undine Texas, LLC (applicants) for approval of a sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Gregg, Henderson, Limestone, Smith, and Upshur Counties. On October 23, 2019, Commission Staff filed a recommendation on the administrative completeness of the petition.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the application incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before December 23, 2019, the applicants must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies as described in the October 23, 2019 memorandum by Greg Charles. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The applicants must not issue notice until the application is deemed administratively complete.

On or before January 23, 2020, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
