

APPLICATION OF QUADVEST, L.P. TO AMEND A WATER CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY S PUBLIC UTILLITY COMMISSION
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COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS OF THE APPLICATION AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

COMES NOW Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 2, files this, its Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness of the Application and Proposed Procedural Schedule. Staff recommends that the application be found sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On March 11, 2019, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 in Montgomery County, Texas. The requested area includes approximately 92 acres and currently has no customers.

On April 8, 2019, the Commission Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 2, finding the application incomplete and deficient and requiring Quadvest to file a supplement to cure the application deficiencies by May 10, 2019. Quadvest filed supplemental information on April 22, 2019.

Order No. 2 also directed Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and to propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application by June 10, 2019. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Roshan Pokhrel of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information filed by Quadvest and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.



III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Quadvest proceed with providing public notice. Specifically, Staff recommends that Quadvest be directed to use the attached *Notice for Publication* form to publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Montgomery County. Staff further recommends that Quadvest be directed to use the attached *Notice to Neighboring Systems, Customers and Cities* form to complete the following actions:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - d) any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.
- 2) Provide correct notice of the application to the following:
 - Aqua Texas Inc.(CCN No. 13203)
 - City of Conroe (CCN No. 10339)
 - Crystal Springs Water Co Inc.(CCN No. 11373)
 - Lone Star GCD
 - Montgomery County Judge
 - San Jacinto River Authority
 - Town of Cut and Shoot (CCN No. 11615)
- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners, and customers.
- 4) Within 30 days of the date of the notice, file in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff, therefore, proposes the following procedural schedule:

Event	Date
Deadline for Quadvest to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation:	July 24, 2019
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice:	Within 10 days of Quadvest filing proof of completed notice with the Commission.
Deadline to intervene:	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued.

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application, as supplemented, be found administratively complete; that Quadvest be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum; and that the above proposed procedural schedule be adopted.

On March 11, 2019, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest or Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 and to decertify a portion of the City of Cut and Shoot's CCN No. 11615 in Montgomery County, Texas, pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Staff has reviewed the additional information filed by the Applicant on April 22, 2019, and recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - d) any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area; and
 - e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Montgomery County.
- 2) Provide correct notice of the application to the following:
 - Aqua Texas, Inc. (CCN No. 13203)
 - City of Conroe (CCN No. 10339)
 - Crystal Springs Water Co., Inc. (CCN No. 11373)
 - Lone Star GCD
 - Montgomery County Judge
 - San Jacinto River Authority
 - Town of Cut and Shoot (CCN No. 11615)
- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ's web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/

4) File in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

Technical Review

The Applicant submitted plans and specifications for the water system to Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) on March 4, 2019. The Applicant should supplement the application filing with a copy of the TCEQ's approval letter once it is received. The approval letter must be on file prior to Staff's making a final recommendation on the application.

Please note: Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to the Applicant. The Applicant will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond, unless additional time is requested by the Applicants.

An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

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
