APPLICATION OF SUNESYS LLC TO RELINQUISH ITS SERVICE PROVIDER CERTIFICATE OF OPERATING AUTHORITY

PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION

OF TEXAS

NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice of Approval addresses the application of Sunesys LLC to relinquish its service provider certificate of operating authority (SPCOA). The Commission approves the relinquishment of and cancels SPCOA number 60958.

I. Findings of Fact

The Commission makes the following findings of fact.

Applicant

- 1. Sunesys was a Delaware limited liability company.
- 2. On December 31, 2018, Sunesys consolidated into Crown Castle Fiber LLC and ceased to exist as a separate entity.

Application

- 3. On August 6, 2019, Sunesys submitted an application to relinquish its SPCOA number 60958 because it consolidated its business into Crown Castle Fiber.
- 4. Sunesys submitted the application in a Commission-approved format, verified by oath, and signed by Neil Dickson, Vice President of Corporate and Commercial Transactions of Crown Castle Fiber.
- 5. Sunesys was granted SPCOA No. 60958 in Docket No. 45242.¹
- 6. Sunesys does not provide any regulated telecommunication services under SPCOA number 60958 and has no local service customers in Texas.
- 7. Sunesys did not maintain any customer deposits.

8. In Order No. 2 issued on August 28, 2019, the administrative law judge found the application sufficient for further review.

<u>Notice</u>

- 9. Sunesys notified the Texas comptroller, Texas secretary of state, and the administrator of the Texas Universal Service Fund of the filing of this application.
- 10. Sunesys has no customers under SPCOA number 60958.

Informal Disposition

- 11. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice provided in this docket.
- 12. No person filed a protest or motion to intervene.
- 13. Commission Staff and Sunesys are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 14. No hearing was requested, and no hearing is necessary.
- 15. Commission Staff recommended approval of the application.
- 16. This decision is not adverse to any party.

II. Conclusions of Law

The Commission makes the following conclusions of law.

- The Commission has jurisdiction over the application under §§ 14.001 and 54.253 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act.²
- 2. Notice of the application was provided in compliance with 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 26.111, 22.54, and 22.55.
- 3. The applicant is entitled to approval of this application, having satisfied the requirements of PURA §§ 54.253 and 16 TAC § 26.111(m).
- 4. The requirements for informal disposition in 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following orders.

- 1. The Commission approves the relinquishment of SPCOA number 60958.
- 2. The Commission cancels SPCOA No. 60958 effective the date of this Notice of Approval.
- 3. Sunesys must cease all operations and cancel any tariffs or interconnection agreements associated with SPCOA number 60958.
- 4. The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted.
