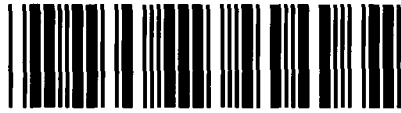

**COMMISSION STAFF'S CORRECTION TO THE NOTICE OF APPROVAL**

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Correction to the Notice of Approval. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

**I. BACKGROUND**

On August 20, 2019, the City of Austin d/b/a Austin Energy (Austin Energy) filed a request to add two hundred and twenty-eight (228) new microgenerators to its Aggregation Unit 1 facility and certify a total of two hundred and twenty-eight (228) new facilities as renewable energy credit (REC) generators, pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 25.173(o). Austin Energy indicated that all two hundred and twenty-eight (228) facilities are new customer-sited solar PV systems that were installed between April 1, 2019 and June 30, 2019.

On September 25, 2019, the Commission administrative law judge (ALJ) issued a notice of approval in this docket. Under the Commission rules, specifically, 16 TAC § 22.35(c)(1), parties may file suggested corrections to a notice of approval within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of such notice. Therefore, Staff's suggested correction in this pleading is timely filed.<sup>1</sup>

**II. STAFF'S PROPOSED CORRECTION**

Staff proposes the following correction to the notice of approval:

Modify the final paragraph to account for the addition of Austin Energy's REC generators to its existing microgenerator aggregator registration.

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<sup>1</sup> Fifteen (15) days from the date the notice of approval was issued (September 25, 2019) is Thursday, October 10, 2019.

The application of Austin Energy includes the information required under 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 25.173(d)(4), (e), (o) and (q). The facilities satisfy the requirements under 16 TAC § 25.173(e)(1) and (4) as new facilities, capable of being metered and verified, and not powered by fossil fuel. Accordingly, the Commission certifies the facilities as REC generators and adds the facilities to Austin Energy's Aggregation Unit 1 facility registration. ~~a REC microgenerator aggregator.~~

### III. CONCLUSION

Staff respectfully requests that the Commission ALJ adopt the correction proposed above.
