COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON PROPOSED NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Third Supplemental Recommendation on Proposed Notice and Proposed Procedural Schedule in response to Order No. 6. Staff recommends that Swift Water Supply Corporation (Swift) be directed to provide notice as directed below and in the attached memorandum and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted. In support thereof, Staff would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On August 21, 2019, Swift filed an application to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 11420 in Nacogdoches County. The requested area consists of approximately 3,136 acres and 62 current customers. Swift filed supplemental information on October 14, 2019, December 16, 2019, January 7, 2020 and February 10, 2020.

Order No. 6 issued on April 15, 2020, found the application administratively complete and required Staff to file a recommendation on the proposed notice and a proposed procedural schedule by April 28, 2020. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, from Patricia Garcia in the Commission's Infrastructure Division, Staff recommends that Swift proceed with providing public notice. Specifically, Staff recommends that Swift be directed to use the attached *Notice to Landowners*, *Neighboring Systems, and Cities* form to complete the following actions:

- 1. Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
 - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:

- Angelina & Neches River Authority
- Appleby WSC (CCN No. 10376)
- Attoyac Bayou Watershed Authority
- City of Appleby
- City of Nacogdoches (CCN No. 11182)
- Libby WSC (CCN No. 10943)
- b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Nacogdoches County Judge
- c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Pineywoods GCD
- d. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
- e. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

Addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the Water Utility Database at http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/.

- 2. Publish notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the requested area is located, once each week for two consecutive weeks. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Applicant must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.
- 3. Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4. Provide a copy of map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers.

5. File in the docket a map and copy of notice along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Event	Date
Deadline for Swift to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	June 12, 2020
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	June 22, 2020
Deadline to intervene	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that Swift be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.

On August 21, 2019, Swift Water Supply Corporation (Swift Water or Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11420 in Nacogdoches County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237. The total service area being requested includes approximately 3,123 acres and 62 current customers.

Staff from the Rate Regulation Division and the Infrastructure Division have reviewed the additional information filed by the Applicant on February 10, 2020 and Order No. 6, which deemed the application administratively complete. Staff recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1. Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
 - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
 - Angelina & Neches River Authority
 - Appleby WSC (CCN No. 10376)
 - Attoyac Bayou Watershed Authority
 - City of Appleby
 - City of Nacogdoches (CCN No. 11182)
 - Libby WSC (CCN No. 10943)
 - b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Nacogdoches County Judge
 - c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Pineywoods GCD
 - d. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
 - e. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

Technical Content:

The Applicant states there are no plans for facilities to serve the requested area. The PUCT cannot finalize approval of the CCN amendment until construction is approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for the facilities and distribution system to serve the requested area and the approval letters are filed in this docket per 16 TAC § 24.233(a)(14).

The Applicant must supplement the application with a copy of the construction approval letters from TCEQ for the facilities and distribution system to serve the requested area. Applicant must file the approval letters prior to Staff making a final recommendation on the application.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to the Applicant. The Applicant will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.


