**COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE  
COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE**

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed insufficient for further review and that the applicant be ordered to address the identified deficiencies. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

**I. BACKGROUND**

On August 23, 2019, Mustang Special Utility District (Mustang SUD) filed a petition to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11856 and sewer CCN No. 20930 in Denton County. The requested service area consists of approximately 1,103 acres and currently has 376 customers.

On September 5, 2019, the Administrative Law Judge issued Order No. 1, was issued, setting a deadline of September 23, 2019, for Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

**II. DEFICIENCY RECOMMENDATION**

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Nabaraj Pokharel in the Commission's Infrastructure Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively incomplete at this time. Staff recommends that Mustang SUD be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Mr. Pokharel's memorandum by October 23, 2019, and that Staff be given a deadline of November 25, 2019, to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application. Staff notes that Mustang SUD should not issue notice until the application is found administratively complete.

### **III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural schedule for further processing of this docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation for application sufficiency.

### **IV. CONCLUSION**





**Subject:** **Docket 49891**, Application of Mustang Special Utility District to Amend its Certificates of Convenience and Necessity in Denton County

On August 23, 2019, Mustang Special Utility District (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water and sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11856 and 20930, respectively in Denton County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 - 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

A Staff review of the above referenced application found deficiencies in the required application; therefore, Staff recommends that the application be deemed insufficient for filing and administratively incomplete.

Application Content:

The requested areas overlap the following cities, which requires written consent from the cities allowing Mustang SUD to provide retail water service within their municipal boundaries. The relevant content provided in the application is deficient.

- City of Celina
- Town of Little Elm

Mapping Content:

There are gaps and overlaps between Mustang SUD's CCN No. 11856 and the requested area 2 (water). The Applicant will need to remove the overlaps from the requested area 2 (water). If the gaps are not intended, the Applicant must add area to the requested area 2 (water) in order to remove the gaps with Mustang SUD's existing CCN.

Staff recommends the Applicant provide the following item to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

Digital data for the requested areas for water, as polygon records, provided in a shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters).

Staff recommends the Applicant obtain additional mapping guidance from the PUC's mapping staff, Ms. Tracy Montes at (512)936-7187 or [tracy.montes@puc.texas.gov](mailto:tracy.montes@puc.texas.gov) to resolve the mapping deficiencies.
