PROPOSED ORDER

This Order addresses the application of Border to Border Communications, Inc. (BTBC) for true-up of 2017 Federal Universal Service Fund (FUSF) impacts to the Texas Universal Service Fund (TUSF). The Commission approves BTBC's request to receive an additional \$262,605 from the TUSF for calendar year 2017.

I. Background

In Docket No. 47387,¹ the Commission approved BTBC's application to recover funds from the TUSF and ordered a true-up of revenues for 2017. The final order in Docket No. 47387 required BTBC to, by October 1, 2019, perform a true-up and report to the Commission the final and actual FUSF impacts for 2017.²

II. Findings of Fact

The Commission makes the following findings of fact.

Applicant

- 1. BTBC is a Texas non-profit corporation registered with the Texas secretary of state under file number 120571000.
- 2. BTBC is an incumbent local exchange carrier that serves fewer than 31,000 access lines.

Application

3. On October 31, 2019, BTBC filed the application at issue in this proceeding to true-up 2017 FUSF impacts recovered from the TUSF.

- 4. In Docket No. 47387, the Commission approved BTBC's request to recover \$1,075,358 from the TUSF to address projected reductions of the amount BTBC would receive in FUSF revenue for 2017.
- 5. BTBC states that the FUSF revenue reductions for 2017 were higher than projected and requests approval to receive an additional \$262,605 from the TUSF for calendar year 2017.
- 6. On August 7, 2020, BTBC supplemented its application.
- 7. In Order No. 3 filed on December 19, 2019, the administrative law judge (ALJ) found the application administratively sufficient.

Notice

- 8. Notice of the application appeared in the November 22, 2019, issue of the *Texas Register*.
- 9. In Order No. 3 filed on December 19, 2020, the ALJ found notice sufficient.

Evidence

- 10. On September 8, 2020, the parties filed a joint proposed motion to admit evidence.
- 11. In Order No. 8 filed on November 4, 2020, the ALJ admitted the following evidence into the record of this proceeding: (a) BTBC's application, including all attachments, filed on October 31, 2019; (b) Notice of the application published in the *Texas Register* on November 22, 2019; (c) Commission Staff's recommendation on the sufficiency of the application filed on December 17, 2019; (d) BTBC's response to Commission Staff's first request for information filed on February 28, 2020; (e) BTBC's correction and supplemental data in support of 2017 True-Up, including all attachments filed on August 7, 2020; and (f) Commission Staff's recommendation on final disposition, including all attachments, filed on August 19, 2020.

True-Up of 2017 Impact Recovery

12. In Docket No. 47387, it was reasonably projected that the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) USF/ICC Transformation Order, Regression Analysis Order, Analysis Order,

Third Order on Reconsideration,⁵ and the March 2016 Order⁶ would reduce the amount that BTBC received in FUSF revenue by \$1,075,358 for the calendar year 2017. It was determined that BTBC would recover this amount from the TUSF.

- 13. The difference between the projected amount in FUSF revenue reductions that BTBC recovered from the TUSF in Docket No. 47387 and the actual amount in FUSF revenue reductions for calendar year 2017 was \$262,605.
- 14. Based on the additional revenue reductions for calendar year 2017 of \$262,605, and the supporting documentation, BTBC should recover \$262,605 from the TUSF.

Informal Disposition

- 15. At least 15 days have passed since the completion of notice in this docket.
- 16. No person filed a protest or motion to intervene.
- 17. BTBC and Commission Staff are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 18. No party requested a hearing and no hearing is necessary.
- 19. This decision is not adverse to any party.
- 20. Commission Staff recommended approval of the application.

III. Conclusions of Law

The Commission makes the following conclusions of law.

- 1. The Commission has authority over this proceeding under PURA⁷ § 56.025.
- 2. Notice of the application complies with 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.55.
- 3. The Commission processed the application in accordance with the requirements of PURA, the Administrative Procedure Act,⁸ and Commission rules.
- 4. The application meets the requirements of PURA § 56.025 and 16 TAC § 26.406.

- 5. The application complies with the requirement to perform a true-up addressed in the final order in Docket No. 47387.
- 6. The requirements for informal disposition pursuant to 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

IV. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following orders.

- 1. The Commission approves the application and BTBC will recover an additional \$262,605 from the TUSF.
- 2. The administrator of the TUSF will timely make the payment to BTBC upon presentation of this order at the next scheduled payment to BTBC.
- 3. In the event that there are future actions by the FCC that would be retroactive and impact the 2017 true-up numbers, the Commission retains the opportunity to modify its true-up calculations.
- 4. The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted.
