**ORDER NO. 2  
FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT,  
AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

This Order addresses the application of SWWC Utilities, Inc. dba Water Services, Inc. and Monarch Utilities I, L.P. for approval of the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate of convenience and necessity rights in Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Hays, Kendall, Kerr, and Medina Counties, and the sufficiency of the application.

The administrative law judge finds the application incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before February 14, 2020, the applicants must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies as described in the January 13, 2020, memorandum by Nabaraj Pokharel. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The applicants must not issue notice until the application is deemed administratively complete.

On or before March 16, 2020, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
