



## APPLICATION OF MONARCH UTILITIES 1, L.P. AND GOINS UTILITY SERVICE LLC FOR SALE, TRANSFER, OR MERGER OF FACILITIES AND UNCERTIFICATED AREA OF POLK COUNTY

#### **COMMISSION STAFF'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION**

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**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Request for Extension. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

#### I. BACKGROUND

On January 8, 2020, Monarch Utilities 1, L.P. (Monarch) and Goins Utility Service LLC (Goins) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for approval of the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and uncertificated area in Polk County. Monarch seeks to purchase all the water and wastewater assets of Goins. The requested sale and transfer includes 36 connections and approximately 17 total acres for the requested water service area and approximately 24 total acres for the requested sewer service area. The Applicants filed supplemental information to their application on March 10, 2020, April 7, 2020, and on April 27, 2020.

On July 7, 2020, the Commission administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 5, finding the application administratively complete and directing the Applicants to provide proof of notice by July 31, 2020. On August 6, 2020, the ALJ issued Order No. 6, granting Monarch's request for extension to file proof of notice and extending the deadline to August 7, 2020.

On September 2, 2020, the ALJ issued Order No. 7, finding the notice sufficient and requiring Staff to request a hearing or file a recommendation on the approval of the sale and CCN amendment by October 1, 2020. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

## II. REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

Pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.4(b), Staff may request that the time allowed for filing any documents be extended for good cause. Staff requires additional time to review the application, the amendments to the application, and the responses to Staff's discovery

requests to make a recommendation regarding the approval of the sale and CCN amendment. As such, Staff requests that the deadline for Staff to request a hearing or file a recommendation on the approval of the sale and CCN amendment be extended to October 15, 2020.

## IV. REVISED PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the procedural schedule be amended consistent with its Request for Extension:
