ORDER NO. 6 DENYING DISMISSAL AND ESTABLISHING FINAL OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses Commission Staff's July 17, 2020, motion to dismiss Kenneth V Land and Greg Coburn's (collectively, applicants) application for sale, transfer, or merger of an exempt utility registration for failure to prosecute under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 22.181(d)(6). Commission Staff states, since the filing of the application, applicants have not made supplemental filings or attempted to cure the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff since the docket filed. For this reason, Commission Staff recommends this application be dismissed, without prejudice, for failure to prosecute.

The administrative law judge denies Commission Staff's recommendation that this proceeding be dismissed and will enable applicants a final opportunity to cure their application.

By September 2, 2020, applicants must cure the deficiencies identified in Elisabeth English's memorandum dated April 13, 2020, and as described in Order No. 4 filed on April 15, 2020.

By September 23, 2020, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness and notice and propose a procedural schedule for further processing, if appropriate. As before, if the recommendation is that this application remains deficient, Commission Staff may again move for dismissal.

Failure of applicants to respond may result in a dismissal of this proceeding.
