COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON AMENDED MAPS

On February 18, 2020, the City of Alton (Alton) filed an application to amend its sewer certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 20809 in Hidalgo County. The requested area consists of 1,434 total acres and 76 customer connections.

On September 29, 2021, the administrative law judge filed Order No. 15, amending the procedural schedule and requiring Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file a supplemental recommendation on the amended maps by November 2, 2021. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. RECOMMENDATION ON AMENDED MAPS

Commission Staff recommends that the supplemental mapping information and amended maps are deficient. Commission Staff has attached the memorandum of Patricia Garcia of the Commission's Infrastructure Division to further detail the identified deficiencies in Alton's mapping.

II. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Commission Staff proposes the following procedural schedule in accordance with the above recommendations.

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully request that Alton be ordered to supplement its mapping as outlined in Ms. Garcia's memorandum.

On February 18, 2020, the City of Alton (Alton) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 20809 in Hidalgo County, Texas under Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Alton is seeking to amend a sewer CCN for the service area containing approximately 1,434 acres and 76 existing customers. In response to Staff's first request for information (RFI 1), Alton provided a map showing the city limit boundaries, areas where there are requests for service, current customers, facilities, and the intermediate parcels between each type of parcel. Alton also stated there are currently 246 existing connections and 131 additional onsite sewer facilities in the areas.

The digital mapping data filed late by Alton on October 20, 2021 is deficient. Alton filed a shapefile that matches the same exact boundary of the original requested area they previously filed on June 8, 2020. Alton did not file revised digital mapping data or a revised detailed map as requested in Staff's recommendation filed on September 28, 2021.

Due to the need for service issue, I am recommending Alton reduce the requested area to include only the area inside the city limits, areas where there are current facilities operated and maintained by Alton, current Alton customers, intermediate parcels, and the requests for service identified on the map provided in response to Staff RFI 1-1. Provide the revised mapping documentation listed below that reflects the recommended reduction in the requested area:

- A revised detailed map identifying only the requested area, in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads; and

- Revised digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet).

Staff will need at least 30 days to review the documentation, maps, and digital data provided by Alton and draft a recommendation.
