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1. Historical five-year reporting period: 2015 through 2019

What percentage of overhead transmission facilities greater than 60 kilovolts did you inspect for compliance with the National Electric Safety Code (NESC) relating to vertical clearance in the historical five-year reporting period?

Farmers' Electric Cooperative, Inc. of New Mexico (FECNM) does not own or control any transmission facilities greater than 60 kilovolts in the State of Texas.

FECNM does operate 267 miles of 69 kilovolt transmission line in the State of New Mexico. FECNM inspects 100 percent of transmission line annually for abnormalities requiring maintenance, including compliance with the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC) relating to vertical and horizontal clearances in the historical five-year reporting period.

2. Future five-year reporting period: 2020 through 2024

What percentage of overhead transmission facilities greater than 60 kilovolts do you anticipate you will inspect for compliance with the NESC relating to vertical clearance during the future five-year reporting period beginning on January 1 of the year in which this report is submitted?

Farmers' Electric Cooperative, Inc. of New Mexico (FECNM) does not own or control any transmission facilities greater than 60 kilovolts in the State of Texas.

FECNM does operate 267 miles of 69 kilovolt transmission line in the State of New Mexico.
