I believe that all of the customers agree that a rate increase is warranted.

However, the customers agree that the increase (100%) which Mr. Payne is requesting is excessive.

All rates should be comparable to other area water systems.

I would also like to add that Mr. Payne has neglected regular maintenance on the system by letting leaks go unrepaired for weeks or years.

One example is a leak which developed across the road at our house. The leak was reported several times over a three-year span. The leak developed into a large mosquito infested hole.

A year or so ago after repeated calls they showed up to fix the leak. They dug a large hole which they left uncovered. It still leaked. This large hole filled with water. This lasted for about a year.

After repeated calls they again came out and fixed the leak properly after three years.

There are numerous other examples of unrepaired leaks on this system. Mr. Payne apparently does not have a regular repair man but uses men from his farming interests.

I do not feel that a 100% rate increase is justified or that maintenance will improve.
