Whispering Ridge Water Rate Increase Proposal

The <u>one</u> water well inside the Whispering Ridge addition in Clifton, Texas services 29 residential homes. There are several swimming pools in the addition, as well as numerous sprinkler systems. My home is on the highest level in the addition. My water pressure is acceptable, but not great. I would like to see a booster pump installed at the well so all neighbors could receive the optimal pressure. There was only one holding tank by the well for years and then after several episodes of no water in the summer and fall of 2018, a new additional holding tank was added in the summer of 2019. This was done only after so many new homes had come on line in the neighborhood over the last four years. There have <u>still</u> been episodes of no water and a continuing problem of low water pressure to many of the neighbors.

I understand and accept the need for a <u>reasonable</u> rate increase, but I think this rate is above and beyond the need, <u>until</u> regular mandated maintenance (not just a bottle of bleach), water reliability and standardized water pressure are <u>assured</u> to all participants. Mr. Payne held a meeting in the summer. He indicated that this rate increase is because the PUC has told him to do it! I have been told by someone in touch with PUC that that is not true. He also was telling us what a problem it is to own this well and that if the pump breaks, he doesn't have the money to fix it!!! One neighbor offered to buy the well and he refused to talk with him.

There is a stipulation in our neighborhood homeowner's guide that states we cannot drill our own water well, so in other words, Mr. Payne (who by the way, developed the neighborhood) has us all "over the barrel"! We do not have a Homeowner's Association here.
