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ORDER

This Order addresses the application of Lakeside Municipal Utility District No. 3 and Manville Water Supply Corporation (WSC) to decertify a portion of Manville WSC's water service area under water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 11144 in Travis and Williamson counties. The Commission amends Manville WSC's water CCN number 11144 by decertification of the 283 acres as described in this Order.

I. Findings of Fact

The Commission makes the following findings of fact.

Applicants

- 1. Lakeside Municipal Utility District No. 3 is a municipal utility district formed under chapter 54 of the Texas Water Code (TWC).
- 2. Lakeside MUD No. 3 operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service in Travis and Williamson counties.
- 3. Lakeside MUD No. 3 owns and operates a public water system approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) under identification number 2270422.
- 4. Lakeside MUD No. 3 does not currently hold a CCN, is not seeking to obtain a CCN as part of the application, and approval of the application will result only in the decertification of a portion of Manville WSC's certificated service area under CCN number 11144.

- 5. Manville WSC is a non-profit corporation registered with the Texas Secretary of State under filing number 26785701.
- 6. Manville WSC operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service under CCN number 11144 in Travis and Williamson counties.
- 7. Manville WSC owns and operates a public water system approved by the TCEQ under identification number 2270033.

Application

- On April 8, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3 filed an application to decertify a portion of Manville WSC's certificated service area under CCN number 11144 in Travis and Williamson counties.
- 9. On July 7, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC jointly filed an amended application, adding Manville WSC as a joint applicant, including additional information, and moving that the application be restyled to reflect the joint applicants.
- 10. Tony Graf, Manville WSC's general manager and authorized representative, consented to the requested decertification in an oath attached to the amended application.
- 11. The water service area, to be decertified, consists of 283 acres and 754 current customers.
- 12. The 283 acres is located west of downtown Pflugerville within Pflugerville's extraterritorial jurisdiction and is bounded on the north by County Road 138; on the east by County Road 137; on the south by Rowe Lane; and on the west by State Highway 130.
- 13. In Order No. 5 filed on August 19, 2020, the administrative law judge (ALJ) found the application, as amended, administratively complete and restyled the application.

Notice

- 14. On September 17, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC filed the affidavit of J.D. Scott, president of the board of Lakeside MUD No. 3, attesting that notice was mailed to neighboring utilities, county authorities, municipalities, customers, and affected parties on September 1 and September 3, 2020.
- 15. On September 17, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC filed a publisher's affidavit attesting that notice was published in the *Austin American-Statesman*, a

newspaper of general circulation in Travis and Williamson counties, on September 2 and 9, 2020.

16. In Order No. 6 filed on September 28, 2020, the ALJ found the notice sufficient.

Evidentiary Record

- 17. On December 14, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3, Manville WSC, and Commission Staff filed an agreed motion to admit evidence.
- 18. In Order No. 7 filed on May 27, 2021, the ALJ admitted the following evidence into the record of this proceeding: (a) Lakeside MUD No. 3's application and attachments filed on April 8, 2020; (b) Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC's amended application and attachments filed on July 7, 2020; (c) Commission Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness filed on August 18, 2020; (d) Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC's affidavits of proof of notice filed on September 17, 2020; (e) Commission Staff's recommendation on sufficiency of notice filed on September 25, 2020; (f) Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC's signed consent forms filed on November 23, 2020; and (g) Commission Staff's final recommendation, with attached map and certificate, filed on December 3, 2020.

Continuous and Adequate Service

19. By agreement, every present and future customer within the 283 acres will continue to be served by Lakeside MUD No. 3.

Reduction of Service

20. Neither the present nor future service provided within the boundaries of Manville WSC's CCN number 11144 will be adversely affected by the reduction in its CCN area, as Manville WSC will still provide continuous and adequate service to its remaining areas.

Consent of Certificate Holder

- 21. Manville WSC has provided written consent to decertify the 283 acres located within its service-area boundaries.
- 22. Manville WSC is no longer providing continuous and adequate water service in the 283 acres located within its boundaries.

<u>vervice</u> Provider

23. Lakeside MUD No. 3 already provides and will continue to provide water service to the283 acres located within its boundaries.

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24. Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC have agreed to a wholesale water supply contract, through which Lakeside MUD No. 3 will purchase water from Manville WSC and serves as compensation for the decertification.

Service After Decertification

- 25. After decertification of the 283 acres, Manville WSC will no longer be obligated to serve the area.
- 26. After decertification of the 283 acres, Lakeside MUD No. 3 will continue to serve the 754 existing customers.

Service Sainter of Existing Service

- Lakeside MUD No. 3 has an approved TCEQ public water system, identification number 2270422.
- 28. Lakeside MUD No. 3 does not have any violations listed in the TCEQ database.

sived for Additional Service

29. There is a need for service to continue because there are currently 754 current customers and a projected 942 single family residential lots, an amenity center, and three irrigation lines in the area to be decertified that will require service.

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- 30. Manville WSC will supply treated drinking water to Lakeside MUD No. 3 under a wholesale water contract.
- 31. Lakeside MUD No. 3 will continue to provide service to current and future customers in the 283 acres.
- 32. Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC provided proper notice of the application to water retail public utilities serving the proximate area and no protests or adverse comments were filed; therefore, there will not be any effect on any water retail public utilities serving the proximate area.

Ability to Serve: Managerial and Technical

- 33. Lakeside MUD No. 3 provides service through a TCEQ-approved public water system 2270422 and has adequate capacity to meet the current and projected demands in the 283 acres.
- 34. Manville WSC will supply water to Lakeside MUD No. 3 under the wholesale water supply contract attached to the amended application as exhibit A. This contract will remain in effect after the decertification of the 283 acres from Manville WSC from CCN number 11144, which will allow Lakeside MUD No. 3 to continue to provide continuous and adequate retail water service.
- 35. Lakeside MUD No. 3 has the managerial and technical capability to provide continuous and adequate service to the requested area.

Feasibility of Obtaining Service from Adjacent Utilities

36. It is not economically feasible for an adjacent retail public utility to provide service to the 283 acres because the area is currently certificated to Manville WSC and is located within Lakeside MUD No. 3's boundaries.

Environmental Integrity and Effect on the Land

37. No physical changes are being made to the land as a result of the decertification; therefore, decertification will have no effect on the environmental integrity or effect on the land.

Improvement is Service or Lowering of Cost

38. Lakeside MUD No. 3 will continue to provide water service to the existing customers in the 283 acres with no change in cost to customers.

Map and Certificate

- On November 9, 2020, Commission Staff emailed the proposed final map and certificate to Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC.
- 40. On November 23, 2020, Lakeside MUD No. 3 filed the signed consents to the proposed map and certificate for both Lakeside MUD No. 3 and Manville WSC.
- 41. On December 3, 2020, Commission Staff filed the proposed map and certificate as an attachment to its final recommendation.

Informal Disposition

- 42. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice provided in this docket.
- 43. No person filed a protest or motion to intervene.
- 44. Lakeside MUD No. 3, Manville WSC, and Commission Staff are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 45. No party requested a hearing and no hearing is needed.
- 46. Commission Staff recommended approval of the amended application.
- 47. This decision is not adverse to any party.

II. Conclusions of Law

The Commission makes the following conclusions of law.

- The Commission has authority over this proceeding under TWC §§ 13.041, 13.242, 13.246, 13.250, and 13.254.
- 2. Manville WSC is a retail public utility as defined in TWC § 13.002(19) and a water supply corporation as defined in 16 TAC § 24.3(40).
- 3. Lakeside MUD No. 3 is a municipal utility district operating under Chapters 49 and 54 of the TWC and is a retail public utility as defined in TWC § 13.002(19).
- 4. Notice of the application was provided in compliance with TWC § 13.246 and 16 TAC § 24.235.
- 5. The Commission processed the application in accordance with the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act,¹ the TWC, and Commission rules.
- 6. Lakeside MUD No. 3 possesses the managerial and technical capability to provide continuous and adequate service to the decertified area as required by TWC § 13.241(a) and 16 TAC § 24.227.

- After evaluating the factors in TWC § 13.246(c) and 16 TAC § 24.227(e), Lakeside MUD No. 3 has demonstrated adequate managerial and technical capability to provide continuous and adequate service to the decertified area in Travis and Williamson counties.
- 8. Except for nonpayment of charges, nonuse, or other similar reasons in the usual course of business, Lakeside MUD No. 3 may not discontinue, reduce, or impair retail water service to any ratepayer in the decertified area without approval of the Commission in accordance with TWC § 13.250(d).
- 9. Manville WSC has demonstrated that amendment to CCN number 11144 by decertification will serve the public interest and is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public as required by TWC § 13.246(b) and 16 TAC § 24.227(c).
- 10. Manville WSC must record a certified copy of its approved map and certificate, along with a boundary description of the service area, in the real property records of Travis and Williamson counties within 31 days of receiving this Order and submit evidence of the recording to the Commission in accordance with TWC § 13.257(r) and (s).
- 11. The requirements for informal disposition under 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following orders:

- The Commission amends Manville WSC's water CCN number 11144 by decertification of the 283 acres as described in this Order and shown on the attached map.
- 2. The Commission issues the certificate attached to this Order.
- 3. The Commission approves the map attached to this Order.
- 4. Except for nonpayment of charges, nonuse, or other similar reasons in the usual course of business, Lakeside MUD No. 3 may not discontinue, reduce, or impair retail water service to any ratepayer within the decertified area without approval of the Commission.
- 5. Manville WSC must serve every customer and applicant for service within the areas approved under CCN number 11144 who requests water service and meets the terms of

Manville WSC's water CCN number 11144 and such service must be continuous and adequate.

- 6. Manville WSC must comply with the recording requirements in TWC § 13.257(r) and (s) for the area in Travis and Williamson counties affected by the application and file evidence of the recording in this docket no later than 45 days after receipt of this Order.
- 7. The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relied, if not expressly granted.

Manville Water Supply Corporation

having obtained certification to provide water utility service for the convenience and necessity of the public, and it having been determined by this Commission that the public convenience and necessity would in fact be advanced by the provision of such service, Manville Water Supply Corporation is entitled to this

Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 11144

to provide continuous and adequate water utility service to that service area or those service areas in Travis and Williamson Counties as by final Order or Orders duly entered by this Commission, which Order or Orders resulting from Docket No. 50745 are on file at the Commission offices in Austin, Texas; and are matters of official record available for public inspection; and be it known further that these presents do evidence the authority and the duty of the Manville Water Supply Corporation to provide such utility service in accordance with the laws of this State and Rules of this Commission, subject only to any power and responsibility of this Commission to revoke or amend this Certificate in whole or in part upon a subsequent showing that the public convenience and necessity would be better served thereby.
