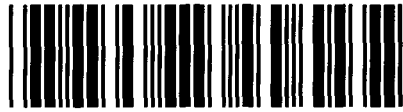

**COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE
COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE**

COMES NOW the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete. In support, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On May 4, 2020, West Harrison Water Supply Corporation (West Harrison) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12728 in Harrison County, Texas under the provisions of Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237. On May 13, 2020, West Harrison filed supplemental information.

On May 7, 2020, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of June 8, 2020 for Staff to file a recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and notice and for the parties to propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information filed by West Harrison and, as detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis of the Commission's Infrastructure Division, recommends that it be found administratively complete from a technical perspective. Staff further recommends, as detailed in the attached memorandum of Fred Bednarski of the Commission's Rate Regulation Division, that the application be deemed sufficient from a financial perspective.

III. RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE

Staff recommends that West Harrison proceed with providing public notice as detailed in Ms. Mathis's memorandum. Specifically, Staff recommends that West Harrison issue notice and provide proof of notice having been issued using the notices and affidavits attached to this filing.

IV. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be deemed administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

| Deadline to intervene | 30 days after notice is issued |

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application be found administratively complete at this time and that West Harrison provide notice as directed. Staff further requests adoption of the procedural schedule above.

¹ Staff has included this deadline because West Harrison has not yet made a filing responsive to Order No. 1; however, Staff does not recommend that the missing filing delay a finding of sufficiency.

On May 4, 2020, West Harrison Water Supply Corporation (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12728 in Harrison County, Texas under Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Staff from the Rate Regulation Division and Infrastructure Division have reviewed the information filed by the Applicant on May 4, 2020 and recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
 - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
 - *Gill WSC (CCN No. 10365)*
 - *Talley WSC (CCN No. 10414)*
 - *Little Cypress Utility District*
 - *Sabine River Authority*
 - b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - *Harrison County Judge*
 - c. Each owner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
 - d. Any affected customers and other affected parties in the requested area.

Addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the Water Utility Database at <http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch>. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) web site located at <http://www.tceq.texas.gov/water/>.

- 2) Publish notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the requested area is located, once each week for two consecutive weeks. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the

notice was mailed, Applicant must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.

- 3) Provide notice and proof of notice using the attached notice and affidavit forms, which Staff has filed in native format.
- 4) Provide a copy of map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to the Applicant. The Applicant will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI.

On May 4, 2020, West Harrison Water Supply Corporation (Applicant) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12728 in Harrison County, Texas under the provisions of Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

I reviewed the answers to questions 30 and 31 of the application and did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete from a financial perspective.

The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date. The letter must include the person's name, address, email address and fax number if applicable.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land, landowner's name, address, email address and fax number, if applicable.
