ORDER NO. 2 GRANTING EXTENSION AND MOTION FOR LEAVE; REQUIRING RESPONSE TO MOTIONS TO DISMISS

On June 29, 2020, Chelford City Municipal Utility District filed a response to the complaint. Contemporaneous with the filing of its response, Chelford City MUD requested an extension to permit the filing of its response after the June 24, 2020 deadline established in Order No. 1, stating that it did not receive timely notice of the complaint, and requested an additional fourteen days to file a supplemental response. No party objected to these motions. The administrative law judge grants Chelford City MUD's requested extension. Further, on or before September 23, 2020, Chelford City MUD may file a supplemental response to the complaint.

In its response to the complaint, Chelford City MUD requested that the complaint be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction for reasons related to its status as a municipal utility district. In addition to requesting dismissal on jurisdictional grounds, Chelford City MUD responded to the merits of the complaint.

On June 30, 2020, Mr. Quazi filed a reply to Chelford City MUD's response. Mr. Quazi's reply, however, addressed only the merits of the case and did not address the jurisdictional issue. Thereafter, on July 6, 2020, Commission Staff filed a Statement of Position in the case. In its Statement of Position, Commission Staff also requested dismissal of the complaint on jurisdictional grounds related to the respondent's status as a municipal utility district, under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 22.181(d)(1).

On or before October 9, 2020, Mr. Quazi must file a response to the motions to dismiss filed by Chelford City MUD and Commission Staff. The response must address whether, in light of the respondent's status as a municipal utility district, the Commission has jurisdiction over the complaint.
