THE CITY OF MESQUITE'S REQUEST FOR A RULING

COMES NOW, the City of Mesquite (City) and files this Request for a Ruling on the City of Mesquite's Response to the Commission Staff's (Staff) Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Procedural Schedule.

On July 15, 2020, the Staff filed its Commission Staff's Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Procedural Schedule whereby the Staff declared the City's and Talty Special Utility District's Petition administratively incomplete because, according to the Staff, a Texas Water Code § 13.301 Sale, Transfer, Merger Application is required in order to transfer facilities. The City responded on July 17, 2020 noting that Texas Water Code § 13.301 only applies to transactions involving a "utility" or a "water supply or sewer service corporations" and does not apply to transactions between two political subdivisions. The Commission Staff, in its August 21, 2020 reply to the City's Response agreed that the City and Talty SUD are not subject to Texas Water Code § 13.301, but nevertheless declared without support that it would be in the "public's best interest to have additional oversight to occur between the certificated entities."

The Commission Staff's arguments are inconsistent with both the plain reading of Texas Water Code §§ 13.248 and 13.301, and previous treatment of these types of applications by the Public Utility Commission. Specifically, in PUC Docket No. 48569, Application of Denton

County Fresh Water Supply District No. 10 for Partial Decertification of Its CCN Service Area

and Approval of a Service Area Contract With Mustang Special Utility District Under Texas Water

Code § 13.248 in Denton County, the PUC approved an agreement under Texas Water Code §

13.248 without requiring the filing of a Section 13.301 Application, that involved the transfer of

service area, customers, and facilities. It should also be noted that if the Commission Staff believes

it needs additional information to review the agreement, it may issue a request for information.

But requiring entities that are not subject to Section 13.301 to file such an application under that

section goes beyond the PUC's authority.

The City respectfully requests that the Administrative Law Judge rule on the City's

Response to the Commission Staff's Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and

Proposed Procedural Schedule and determine that a sale, transfer, merger application is not

required in this matter, and order the Staff to reconsider the administrative completeness of the

Petition as it was submitted on June 18, 2020.
