## COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and, in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed deficient at this time. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

#### T. BACKGROUND

On June 18, 2020, the City of Dripping Springs (Dripping Springs), filed an application to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 13030 in Hays County. The requested service area consists of 1,000 acres and has no current customers.

On July 1, 2020, the Commission Administrative Law Judge issued Order No. 1, requiring Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and to propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application by July 20, 2020. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS II.

Staff has reviewed Dripping Spring's application and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis, Infrastructure Division, recommends that it be found administratively incomplete at this time. Specifically, Staff has identified deficiencies in the mapping content included with the application. Staff recommends that Dripping Springs submit supplemental information, as further detailed in the attached memorandum.

Staff notes that Dripping Springs should not issue notice until its application is found administratively complete.

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III. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete. Staff further

recommends that a deadline of September 4, 2020 be established for Dripping Springs to cure the

deficiencies identified in Ms. Mathis's memorandum. Additionally, Staff recommends that a

deadline of October 2, 2020 be established for Staff to review Dripping Spring's supplemental

information and make a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the

application.

Staff intends to propose a revised procedural schedule alongside a subsequent

recommendation for application sufficiency.

IV. **CONCLUSION** 

For the reasons discussed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application be

found administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that the procedural schedule

proposed above be adopted for further processing of this docket.

On June 18, 2020, the City of Dripping Springs filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 13030 in Hays County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant and recommends the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below:

### **Mapping Content:**

Maps submitted with Item 1 on 6/18/2020 are deficient.

Applicant must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

- A general location map identifying only the requested area, in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town.
- A detailed map identifying only the requested area, in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.
- Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); OR metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.
