

**Re: Request to Intervene in P.U.C. Docket No. 51023**

My family lives on one of the twenty-one properties that would be affected by the proposed Route 17 of the P.U.C. Docket No. 51023. We are a single-family dwelling built specifically to be next door and available to my aging parents. We are not like the wealthy families that live in the communities around our neighborhood. We do not have political machine type operatives or lobbyist working on our behalf. We are a simple working couple with our youngest child in public school. A transmission line through our backyard would industrialize the place we call home.

Route 17 would cut along the Western side of our neighborhood through some of the most active wildlife safe zones of our city. Most all the neighbors along this route are appreciative of the natural beauty our property offers. We are one of the oldest County Subdivision in our Tax Zone. In fact, our neighborhood has a grandfathered animal rescue center that protects old and retired zoo, research, and rescued, primates.

There are other proposed routes that would follow existing road and travel routes. The use of existing roads would seem the optimal choice while not encroaching on privately owned land and, by all appearance, would make it easier for the installation of the infrastructure necessary to complete the project. The use of the proposed Route 17 would require the destruction of natural growth vegetation.

Please save natural resources, save on cite preparation costs, and save face with the working-class families of Serene & Scenic Hills Subdivision. The families of our simple county neighborhood are some of the first residents of the area, before the high dollar developments. We may not have the power of numbers, but we have the power of our passion for the natural beauty we have cultivated, protected, and call home.
