From my review of the proposed routes of the transmission lines it would seem best to avoid residential subdivisions as much as possible and place the line next to less inhabited property.

In this regard, it would seem best to not used the routes listed as numbers 5, 14 and 17 as these will pass close to a residential neighborhood which will affect numerous properties and probably have increased cost do to said. The routes that seem the best in staying away from residential property is to use numbers 7 and 8 and then using either 15, 22, 25, 37, 38, 43 or use 7, 16, 56, 57, 27, 47 and then either 44, 45 to cross over this land and provide the energy needs for the area.

While it is understandable that most people and property owners do not want a transmission line near their property, it is my opinion that the routes listed in the above paragraph will allow CPS to provide the energy need of the area, cause as little as possible interference with residential areas and make the cost to acquire the rights over the land as little as possible.
