



STATEMENT OF POSITION OF RONALD SCHAPPAUGH

My name is Ronald Schappaugh. I am an intervenor in this case. I live at 11210 Cimarron Crest, Boerne, TX 78006 which is within the Anaqua Springs Ranch subdivision and I am impacted by the transmission line that is proposed to run along Toutant Beauregard and along the southern border of Anaqua Springs Ranch property.

I am opposed to the routes that are proposed to run along Toutant Beauregard because:

- 1. Currently Toutant Beauregard is a pleasant two-lane country road like the thousands of country lanes that use to contribute to the beauty of so much of the Hill Country and Texas in general. The proposed new high-tension power line with its massive poles will loom over the country side and is proposed to cross back and forth over Toutant Beauregard numerous times despoiling the countryside along its route.
- 2. Ten years ago my wife and I built our retirement home in Anaqua Springs Ranch.
 We selected Anaqua Springs over other similarly priced developments because of the country feeling of the area which we believed would protect and contribute to

our home's future value. The proposed power line along Toutant Beauregard will be detrimental to value of our home which is our most valuable retirement asset.

3. Lastly, I am concerned for the safety of the young children and staff at the Sara McAndrews Elementary School which will <u>literally</u> be in the shadows of the powerline.
