I purchased this property in order to build a retirement home and because it is on the second highest elevation in Bexar County. It has a beautiful 360-degree view of the Texas Hill Country.


The proposed route # 46 goes directly through my property. One of the utility towers will be in the center of my property. This happens to be on the highest elevation. The property will be rendered worthless and my dream of a retirement home will be destroyed, not to mention the property value will be reduced to zero. Who would ever purchase property adjacent to a utility structure? Many say it is a health hazard. For sure it causes radio frequency problems. The proposed route also includes a tower where the High-Country Ranch well is located. The well is used to provide water for the homeowners and for our cattle. The construction will cause problems for the well structure. Also, the area is also home for the Golden Cheeked Warbler which is an endangered species. Birds are very sensitive to electrical currents and the power line could further damage their habitat.

It has come to my attention the land where segment #42 is located has been donated to CPS, ostensibly to influence route selection and direct it away from their property. This action violates all ethical norms and negates any presumption of honesty and fairness in the selection process if proven true.
