COMMISSION STAFF'S SECOND REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

COMES NOW the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and files this Second Request for Extension. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On July 10, 2020, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest), filed an application to discontinue water service and cancel its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 in Jackson County, Texas. The requested service area to be decertified consists of 152 acres and no current customers.

On July 15, 2020, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, requiring Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice on or before August 10, 2020.

On August 7, 2020, Staff filed its First Request for Extension, requesting that the deadline to file its comments on administrative completeness and proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule, be extended to August 24, 2020.

On the same day, the ALJ issued Order No. 2, granting Staff's Request for Extension and requiring Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule by August 24, 2020. Therefore, Staff's filing is delayed, and Staff apologizes for any inconvenience it may have caused to both the ALJ and Quadvest.

II. REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

Pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.4(b), Staff may request that the time allowed for filing any documents be extended for good cause. Staff has been in discussion with

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Quadvest regarding further processing of this docket, including the need for an amended application, and needs additional time to prepare its recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule. As such, Staff requests that the deadline to file its recommendation be extended to October 7, 2020.

III. CONCLUSION

Staff respectfully requests that the ALJ extend the deadline to file comments on administrative completeness and proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule, to October 7, 2020.
