ORDER NO. 2 FINDING PETITION ADMINISTRATIVELY COMPLETE AND NOTICE SUFFICIENT, ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE, AND GRANTING INTERVENTION

In this matter, Imperial Heights, Ltd. seeks streamlined expedited release from Aqua Texas, Inc.'s water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity (CCNs), numbers 13203 and 21065, respectively, in Harris County.

I. Finding Application Administratively Complete

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the petition administratively complete.

II. Notice

The ALJ finds that notice is sufficient.

III. Establishing Procedural Schedule

Under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541, the granting of streamlined expedited release initiates an appraisal process to determine the amount of monetary compensation that may be owed by the landowner to the certificate holder for the tract of land that was released. Therefore, an order granting approval for streamlined expedited release is interim in nature and, in the event the requested release is approved, the docket will continue for the purpose of determining the issue of compensation.
