COMMISSION STAFF'S FINAL RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 2, files this Final Recommendation. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On July 31, 2020, Springs Hill Water Supply Corporation (Springs Hill WSC) and Green Valley Special Utility District (Green Valley SUD) (collectively, Petitioners) filed a petition for approval of a service area contract under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.248 and to amend Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in Guadalupe County. The Petitioners' service area contract is being reviewed in accordance with 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.253. The requested area is approximately 149 acres. On October 22, 2020, Green Valley SUD filed its signed consent forms, and on October 28, 2020, Springs Hill WSC filed its signed consent forms.

On September 1, 2020, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 2, finding the petition administratively complete, notice sufficient, and establishing a deadline of November 5, 2020 for Staff to file its final recommendation on the petition. This pleading is, therefore, timely filed.

II. RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

Staff has reviewed the petition, and as detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis of the Commission's Infrastructure Division, Staff recommends that the petition be approved. Staff further recommends that Petitioners file certified copies of the attached CCN map along with a

written description of the CCN service areas in the Guadalupe County Clerk's Office, pursuant to TWC § 13.257(r) and (s). Copies of the final map and certificates consented to by Petitioners are attached.

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully requests that an order be issued approving the petition.

Springs Hill Water Supply Corporation (Springs Hill WSC) and Green Valley Special Utility District (Green Valley SUD) (collectively, Petitioners) filed a petition with the Public Utility Commission for approval of a service area contract under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.248 and to amend Springs Hill WSC's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10666 and Green Valley SUD's water CCN No. 10646 in Guadalupe County, Texas. The total area being requested includes approximately 149 acres and no current customers.

Specifically, Springs Hill WSC and Green Valley SUD entered into a contractual agreement that permits Springs Hill WSC to provide water service within the agreed upon water service area that will be transferred from Green Valley SUD's CCN to Spring Hill WSC's CCN. Petitioners will not transfer assets or facilities under the terms of the agreement.

Individual notice was not required for this petition because there are no affected customers in the area subject to the transfer. The Petitioners submitted documentation to satisfy the notice requirements under 16 TAC § 24.253(c)(2) and (3).

The petition meets all of the statutory requirements of TWC Chapter 13 and 16 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 24 rules and regulations. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition.


The Petitioners consented to the attached map and certificates on October 22 and 28, 2020.


