## COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS, PROPOSED NOTICE, AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness, Proposed Notice, and Proposed Procedural Schedule. Staff recommends that the application be found sufficient. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

## I. BACKGROUND

On August 12, 2020, Possum Kingdom Water Supply Corporation (PKWSC) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12890 in Palo Pinto County. The requested service area consists of 1,096 acres and 168 current connections.

On August 13, 2020, the administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, requiring Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice by September 11, 2020. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application, and as detailed in the attached memoranda of Patricia Garcia, Infrastructure Division, and Fred Bednarski, Rate Regulation Division, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete and accepted for filing. PKWSC has provided proof that it has submitted plans and specifications for the proposed booster pump station and distribution system needed to serve the requested area to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) but has not yet received TCEQ approval for its plans. Staff cannot recommend final approval of the application until proof of TCEQ approval is filed; however, what has been provided is sufficient for Staff to recommend that the application be found administratively complete. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a

comment on the merits of the application but only that the application is complete for further processing.

#### III. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that PKWSC proceed with providing public notice to all persons, political subdivisions, and other entities listed in the attached memorandum using the notices provided by Ms. Garcia. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that PKWSC provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Staff also recommends that PKWSC publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Palo Pinto County.

Staff recommends that PKWSC file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum and proof of newspaper publication, including tear sheets. Finally, it is recommended that PKWSC use the attached affidavits to meet these requirements.

#### IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete; therefore, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	November 5, 2020

## V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that PKWSC be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in Ms. Garcia's memorandum, and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.

On August 12, 2020, Possum Kingdom Water Supply Corporation (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12890 in Palo Pinto County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Staff from the Rate Regulation Division and Infrastructure Division have reviewed the information filed by the Applicant and recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. Staff further recommends that the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
  - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
    - Brazos River Authority; and
    - Fort Belknap WSC (CCN No. 11042)
  - b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
    - Palo Pinto County Judge
  - c. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
  - d. Any affected customers or other affected parties in the requested area.

Addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the Water Utility Database, <a href="http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch">http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch</a>. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) website, <a href="http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/">http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</a>.

2) Publish notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the requested area is located, once each week for two consecutive weeks. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit

must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Applicant must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.

- 3) Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4) Provide a copy of map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners, and customers.
- 5) File in the docket a map and copy of notice along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication.
- 6) Supplement the application with a copy of the approval letter for the plans and specifications and distribution system from TCEQ once it is received. Applicant must file the approval letters prior to Staff making a final recommendation on the application.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFIs) to the Applicant. The Applicant will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.

On August 12, 2020 Possum Kingdom Water Supply Corporation filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Palo Pinto County, Texas under the provisions of Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

I reviewed the answers provided to questions 30 and 31 of the application and did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete from a financial perspective.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land, the landowner's name, address, email address, and fax number, if applicable.
