# COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON THE APPLICATION AND NOTICE

**COMES NOW** the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and files this Supplemental Recommendation on the Application and Notice. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

## I. BACKGROUND

On September 23, 2020, SWWC Utilities, Inc. dba Hornsby Bend Utility Company, Inc. (Applicant), water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 11978, filed an application to amend its tariff to reflect the increase in the water usage fees charged by the EPCOR 130 Project, Inc. pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.25. Applicant requests to increase the pass-through rate by \$0.04, from \$0.19 to \$0.23 per 1,000 gallons of water. The requested effective date for the increase is on the first meter reading after October 1, 2020.

On November 5, 2020, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed a Notice Finding Application Insufficient, establishing a deadline of December 7, 2020 for Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on the application. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

# II. SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON APPLICATION AND NOTICE

Staff has reviewed the application and Response<sup>1</sup> and, as supported by the attached memorandum of Spencer English, Rate Regulation Division, recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete and that the pass-through rate of \$0.23 per 1,000 gallons be approved. As noted in Applicant's Response,<sup>2</sup> Applicant has requested to reissue updated notice after the pass-through rate has been approved. The updated notice is to be similar in form to the

notice submitted with the application.<sup>3</sup> Accordingly, Staff recommends that the requested changes to Applicant's pass-through rates be approved, contingent upon the Applicant reissuing notice to customers as detailed in Applicants response and in a form similar to the notice submitted with the application.

## III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Staff respectfully recommends approval of the application and proposed pass-through rate contingent on the reissue of notice as described above, that Applicant be ordered to reissue notice and submit proof of notice in this docket after approval of the application, and that the Commission provide Applicant a copy of the attached tariff.

Company for a Pass Through Rate Change

On September 23, 2020, SWWC Utilities, Inc. dba Hornsby Bend Utility Company (Applicant), water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 11978, filed an application to implement a pass-through rate change pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.25 for an increase in the fees billed by EPCOR 130 Project, Inc. (EPCOR 130). The increase by EPCOR 130 raises the usage fee for the Applicant from \$0.19 to \$0.23 per thousand gallons, effective October 1, 2020.

The Applicant has requested an EPCOR 130 pass-through rate increase of \$0.04 per thousand gallons for Austin's Colony, Forest Bluff, Tecolote Farms, Birch Addition, Bountiful Harvest, Mission of Santa Barbara, Twin Creek Meadows, Plain View Estates, Betty Francis Addition, Rod Stewart Addition, Francis Subdivision, Decker Creek Estates, Hornsby Bend, The Tommy Reaux Subdivision, and Trinity Hill subdivisions (PWS ID # 2270255).

I reviewed the true-up filed with the current application and verified the pass-through rate increase. I also verified that EPCOR 130 implemented an increase to purchased water provided to the Applicant, as well as confirmed the source of the \$62,511.02 baseline from 2013.

I have determined that the application and notice meet the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.25(b)(2). I recommend that the application be accepted for filing, approved as requested, and that the Commission provide the Applicant a copy of the attached tariff. I also recommend that the effective notice be filed after approval of the application.

INCREASES IN INSPECTION FEES AND WATER TESTING COSTS IMPOSED BY STATE OR FEDERAL LAW MAY BE PASSED THROUGH AS AN ADJUSTMENT TO THE MONTHLY BASE RATE CHARGE UNDER THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF 16 TAC 24.21(b)(2)(F) AFTER NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS AND UPON WRITTEN APPROVAL BY THE PUC.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY SERVICE FEE

#### **TEMPORARY WATER RATE:**

Unless otherwise superseded by PUC order or rule, if the Utility is ordered by a court or governmental body of competent jurisdiction to reduce its pumpage, production or water sales, the Utility shall be authorized to increase its approved gallonage charge according to the formula:

$$TGC = cgc + \underline{(prr)(cgc)(r)}$$

Where:

TGC = temporary gallonage charge cgc = current gallonage charge

r = water use reduction expressed as a decimal fraction (the pumping restriction)

prr = percentage of revenues to be recovered expressed as a decimal fraction, for this tariff

prr shall equal 0.5.

# <u>PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE - ALL WATER SUBJECT TO FEE:</u>

Changes in fees imposed by any non-affiliated third party water supplier or underground water district having jurisdiction over the Utility shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

$$AG = G + B/(1-L),$$

Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent:

G = approved gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons);

B = change in purchased water/district gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons); L = system average line loss for preceding 12 months not to exceed 0.15

# <u>PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE – PORTION OF WATER SUBJECT TO FEE:</u>

Upon notice from a water supplier of either an increase or a decrease in the cost of purchased water, the utility shall provide notice to customers and the Commission of its intent to implement rates imposed by any non-affiliated third party water supplier or underground water district having jurisdiction over the Utility shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

Adjustment to the gallonage rate:  $AG = (CP/GB) \times 1,000$ 

Adjustment to the minimum bill:  $AMB = GMB \times AG$ 

#### Where:

CP: CP1 - CP0 = Change in cost of purchased water

CP1: Cost of purchased water during the most recent 12 month period at the new rates;

CP0: Cost of purchased water during the most recent 12 month period at the previous rates;

GMB: Number of gallons in the minimum bill, divided by 1,000; and

GB: Number of gallons billed to customers in excess of the amount included in the monthly minimum bill for the 12 Month period used above.

With each annual adjustment to the Purchased Water and/or District Fee Pass-Through, the utility must file a true-up report that shows the pass-through calculation for the next 12 months in the notice. The report shall contain up to five years of data, as available, and show the annual and accumulated differences between the adjusted gallonage charge (AG) and/or the adjustment to the minimum bill (AMB) amounts collected from customers and the amounts actually paid to the entities whose charges are included in the pass-through provision and any other information requested by Commission Staff during the review.

#### FRANCHISE FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE:

Charges a municipality makes for use of streets and alleys pursuant to Tax Code §182.025 or other applicable state law shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

AG = G + B

#### Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent:

G = approved gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons) and

B = projected franchise fees payable (per 1,000 gallons).
