## ORDER NO. 3 FINDING PETITION ADMINISTRATIVELY COMPLETE AND NOTICE SUFFICIENT: ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This Order addresses the September 25, 2020 petition of Destiny Development, LLC to amend West Wise Special Utility District's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10284 in Wise County by streamlined expedited release under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). On October 14, 2020, petitioner filed a supplement to the petition.

On October 26, 2020, Commission Staff recommended that the petition be found administratively complete and notice be found sufficient. The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the petition administratively complete and notice sufficient.

Under the provisions of TWC § 13.2541, the granting of streamlined expedited release initiates an appraisal process to determine the amount of monetary compensation that may be owed by the landowner to the certificate holder for the tract of land that was released. Therefore, if streamlined expedited release is approved, the docket will continue for the purpose of determining the issue of compensation.
