

On February 5, 2021, Entergy Texas, Inc. (ETI) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to implement an interim fuel refund to refund over-coaliseded fuel and purchased power costs as of October 31, 2020 (Application). This liting was made pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin Code § 25 237(a)(3)(3). ETIs filting affects only the recovery of fuel and purchased power costs and does not affect base rates that are currently in effect. All residential, commercial and industrial customers whose electric service rates include charges for fuel pursuant to Rate Schedule FF, entitled "fixed Fuel Factor and Loss Multipliers," in all territories served by ETI, are affected by the Application.

ETI proposes to implement the refund for all other Rate Schedule FF customers over a six-month penod, beginning with ETI's first March 2021 billing cycle.
