### COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS, NOTICE, AND PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On November 4, 2020, Chester Maples dba Old Highway 90 Water Service (Old Highway 90) filed an application to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 12975 in Medina and Frio counties. The application seeks to decertify 11 acres of Benton City Water Supply Corporation's water CCN number 12587, and to amend Old Highway 90's CCN to add the 11 acres plus 589 acres of uncertificated land. Old Highway 90 supplemented its application on December 9 and 10, 2020 and January 19, March 16, and April 14, 2021.

On May 4, 2021, the administrative law judge filed Order No. 7, which set a deadline of May 14, 2021 for the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file a supplemental recommendation on administrative completeness, notice, and propose a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the supplemented application, and as detailed in the attached memoranda of Patricia Garcia, Infrastructure Division, and Fred Bednarski, Rate Regulation Division, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete and accepted for filing. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application but only that it is complete for further processing.

#### II. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that Old Highway 90 proceed with providing public notice to all persons, political subdivisions, and other entities listed in the attached memorandum and using the notices provided by Ms. Garcia. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Old Highway 90 provide an accurate map delineating the requested service

area. Staff also recommends that Old Highway 90 publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Frio and Medina Counties.

Further, Staff recommends that Old Highway 90 file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum and proof of newspaper publication, including tear sheets. Finally, Staff recommends that Old Highway 90 use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

### III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete; therefore, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Old Highway 90 to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along, with a copy of the notice and map sent to the affected parties, and published in a newspaper of general circulation	June 29, 2021
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice and propose a supplemental procedural schedule	July 13, 2021
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

### **IV. CONCLUSION**

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application, as supplemented, be found administratively complete, that Old Highway 90 be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted.

On November 4, 2020, Chester Maples dba Old Highway 90 Water Service filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Medina and Frio Counties under Subchapter G of Texas Water Code Chapter 13.

I reviewed the answers provided to questions 30 and 31 of the application, and did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, I recommend that the Commission deem the application administratively complete from a financial perspective.

On November 4, 2020, Chester Maples dba Old Highway 90 Water Service (Old Highway 90) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 12975 in Medina and Frio Counties, under Texas Water Code §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code §§ 24.225 to 24.237. The requested area includes approximately 600 acres, which is comprised of approximately 589 acres of uncertificated land and 11 acres of area to be decertified from Benton City Water Supply Corporation's CCN No. 12587 and amended to CCN No. 12975. The result of the application will be the addition of approximately 600 acres to Old Highway 90's CCN No. 12975 and the subtraction of approximately 11 acres from Benton City WSC's CCN No. 12587.

The application indicates that the total acreage being requested is approximately 994 acres. However, based on the mapping review by Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, it was determined that the requested area is approximately 600 acres.

Based on the mapping review by Ms. Montes, the maps and digital data filed on April 14, 2021 are sufficient, and based on my technical and managerial review of the additional information filed by Old Highway 90 on December 9 and 10, 2020, January 19, 2021, March 16, 2021, and April 14, 2021, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. I further recommend that Old Highway 90 be ordered to do the following:

1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:

- a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
  - Benton City WSC (CCN No. 12587);
  - Gusville Mobile Home Park (CCN No. 12292);
  - Moore WSC (CCN No. 10212);
  - Yancey WSC (CCN No. 11463);
  - Bexar-Medina-Atascosa Counties WCID 1; and
  - Nueces River Authority
- b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
  - Frio County Judge; and
  - Medina County Judge
- c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
  - Evergreen Underground Water Conservation District
- d. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
- e. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

Addresses can be obtained by Old Highway 90 from the Water Utility Database, <u>http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch</u>. District information and addresses can be obtained from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) website, <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>.

- 2) Publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in each county where the requested area is located. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Old Highway 90 must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.
- 3) Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4) Provide a copy of the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers.
- 5) File in the docket a copy of notice and the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity

to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit and tear sheets for proof of newspaper publication.

6) Supplement the application with a copy of the approval letter for the plans and specifications from TCEQ once it is received. Also provide an approval letter for the distribution system to serve the requested area. Old Highway 90 must file the approval letters prior to Staff making a final recommendation on the application.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to Old Highway 90. Old Highway 90 will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.
