## THE CITY OF KILLEEN'S SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION TO INTERVENE AND REQUEST FOR HEARING

**COMES NOW**, The City of Killeen, Texas ("the City") and files this Supplemental Motion to Intervene and Request for Hearing in the above-captioned proceeding. In support of its Motion, the City shows as follows:

- 1. On November 12, 2020, Kempner Water Supply Corporation ("Kempner") and the City of Georgetown, Texas ("Georgetown") (collectively, "Applicants") filed a "Joint Petition for Approval and Enforcement of a CCN Transfer Agreement Designating Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") Service Areas" in Bell County, Texas, pursuant to Texas Water Code ("TWC") § 13.248, and 16 Texas Admin. Code § 24.253 (the "Petition" or "Application").
- 2. The Applicant's Petition seeks to transfer certain service areas that are within the City of Killeen's extraterritorial jurisdiction ("ETJ") and within 0.2 miles of the City of Killeen's CCN (Water CCN 10041). The closest service area that Kempner Water Supply Corporation currently has (Water CCN 10456) to the service area that is sought to be transferred is, upon information and belief, more than 8 miles away.
- 3. The Applicant's Petition, therefore, implicates questions required by the Commission to be considered pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.227(e), including, but not limited to, questions concerning the need for additional service in the requested area, including, but

not limited to: environmental needs; the effect of amending a CCN on any retail public utility that provides the same service and that is already serving any area within two miles of the boundary of the requested area (including regionalization and economic effects); the ability of the applicant to provide adequate service, including meeting the standards of the TCEQ and the commission, taking into consideration the current and projected density and land use of the requested area; the feasibility of obtaining service from an adjacent retail public utility; environmental integrity; and the effect on the land to be included in the requested area.

- 4. On December 8, 2020, the City filed a Motion to Intervene. On December 15, 2020 the City met and confirmed that it desired to intervene and Request a Hearing. This Supplemental Motion adopts and incorporates by reference its Motion filed on December 8, 2020.
- 5. The City seeks a formal hearing on this matter.
