COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

On November 20, 2020, Compass Datacenters DFW III, LLC (Compass) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Rockett Special Utility District's (Rockett SUD) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10099 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Compass asserts that the tract of land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Ellis County, which is a qualifying county. On June 4, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 6, denying Rockett SUD's second motion to dismiss and directing the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file a recommendation on the final disposition of the petition by July 8, 2021. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

Staff has reviewed the petition and supplemental information, and as detailed in the attached memorandum from Patricia Garcia, Infrastructure Division, recommends that the petition be approved. Staff recommends that Compass has met the requirements of TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), and further recommends that the petition for release of the requested area from Rockett SUD's CCN number 10099 be granted. Staff provides the attached final water CCN map and certificate and recommends that they be provided to Rockett SUD.

Additionally, Staff recommends that Rockett SUD's motion to dismiss be denied. In support of its motion, Rockett SUD argues that the petition should be dismissed because the property is receiving service under the standard set forth in *Texas General Land Office v. Crystal*

Clear Water Supply Corp., 449 S.W.3d 130, (Tex. App.—Austin 2014, pet. denied).¹ Staff disagrees with this assertion. Based on the information provided by the parties, Staff has concluded that the portion of Compass's property that Rockett SUD has identified as receiving service is not included in the area for which release is requested.

Staff further recommends that Rockett SUD's claim of protection under 7 U.S.C. § 1926(b) is moot. The TWC explicitly states that "[t]he utility commission may not deny the petition based on the fact that the certificate holder is a borrower under a federal loan program." While a federal district court had previously held that 7 U.S.C. § 1926(b) preempted TWC § 13.2541 (formerly, TWC § 13.254(a-5) and (a-6)), that decision has been vacated by the Fifth Circuit.

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the petition be approved and that the Commission issue an order consistent with this recommendation.

On November 20, 2020, Compass Datacenters DFW III, LLC (Compass) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Rockett Special Utility District's (Rockett SUD) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10099 in Ellis County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Compass asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Ellis County, which is a qualifying county.

Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, determined that the map and digital data are sufficient for determining the location of the tracts of land considered for streamlined expedited release are located within Rockett SUD's water CCN. Furthermore, Compass provided warranty deeds confirming ownership of the tracts of land within Rockett SUD's certificated service area. In addition, Compass submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the property was not receiving water service from the CCN holder.

Based on the mapping review by Ms. Montes, it was determined that the entire tract of land is 171.158 acres. The portion of the tract considered for release is 149.34 acres. If approved, the area to be released from Rockett SUD (CCN No. 10099) is 149.34 acres.

Rockett SUD requested to intervene. Rockett SUD provided documentation stating that the property is receiving water service and that it is protected by federal loans. However, based on the map provided by Rockett SUD on June 24, 2021, and the maps provided by Compass, the portion of the property that Rockett SUD claims is receiving service is not being requested to be released and will remain a part of Rockett SUD's CCN service area.

In accordance with TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), Compass has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the release of the tract of land from Rockett SUD's

CCN No. 10099. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Additionally, I recommend that a final map and certificate be provided to the CCN holder.


