COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On December 3, 2020, Monarch Utilities I L.P. (Monarch) filed an application to amend its sewer certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) 20899 in Chambers County, Texas. Monarch's application indicates that there are no customers in the areas proposed for decertification. Monarch filed supplemental information on February 17, 2021 and April 29, 2021.

On April 5, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 6 requiring Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate, by May 6, 2021. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed Monarch's application and supplemental information and, as detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis of the Commission's Infrastructure Division, recommends that the supplemented application be found administratively complete and accepted for filing. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application, but only that it is complete for further processing.

II. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Monarch proceed with providing public notice. Specifically, Staff recommends that Monarch be directed to use the attached *Notice for Publication* form to publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Chambers County. Staff further recommends that Monarch be directed to use the attached Notice to Neighboring Systems, Landowners, Customers and Cities form to complete the following actions:

1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:

- a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:

 - Baytown Area Water Authority

- b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Chambers County Judge
- c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - None
- d. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

2) Publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the county where the requested area is located. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Monarch must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.

- 3) Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4) Provide a copy of the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, and customers.
- 5) File in the docket a copy of notice and the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit and tear sheets for proof of newspaper publication.

III. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's administrative completeness recommendation, Staff proposes that the procedural schedule below be adopted:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice and propose a supplemental procedural schedule	July 5, 2021	
Deadline to intervene	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued	

III.CONCLUSION

On December 3, 2020, Monarch Utilities I L.P. (Monarch) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its sewer CCN No. 20899 and to decertify a portion of Gulf Coast Waste Disposal Authority CCN No. 20465 in Chambers County, Texas under Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 to 24.237.

Certificate(s) of Convenience and Necessity in Chambers County

The requested area includes <u>0</u> current customers and approximately <u>120</u> acres, comprised of: <u>93</u> acres of decertified area (from CCN No. 20899).

27 acres of decertified area (from CCN No. 20465 and amended to CCN No. 20899).

The result of the application will be the subtraction of approximately $\underline{66}$ acres from CCN No. 20899.

The result of the application will be the subtraction of approximately $\underline{27}$ acres from CCN No. 20465.

Based on the mapping review by Gary Horton, Infrastructure Division, maps submitted with **Item 14** on 4/29/2021 are sufficient. Based on my technical and managerial review of the additional information filed by Monarch on 4/29/2021, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. I further recommend that Monarch be ordered to do the following:

1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
