### COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS, PROPOSED NOTICE, AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

**COMES NOW** the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness, Proposed Notice, and Proposed Procedural Schedule. Staff recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

### I. BACKGROUND

On December 10, 2020, Markout Water Supply Corporation (Markout WSC) and the City of Mesquite (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for approval of the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Kaufman County. Specifically, the City of Mesquite, certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10060, seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all of the water service area from Markout WSC under water CCN number 10846. The requested area includes approximately 6,279 acres and 1,081 connections. Applicants filed supplemental information on December 17, 2020 and January 4, 2021.

On December 14, 2020, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of January 11, 2021, for Staff to file recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application, proposed notice, and to file a recommendation regarding how to proceed with the application and to propose a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

### II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application filed by the Applicants and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Patricia Garcia of the Commission's Infrastructure Division, and Fred Bednarski of the Commission's Rate Regulation Division, recommends that it be found administratively complete. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application, but only that it is complete for further processing.

### III. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that the Applicants proceed with providing public notice to all current customers, persons, political subdivisions, and other entities listed in the attached memorandum using the notice provided by Ms. Garcia. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Applicants provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Within 30 days of the provision of notice, Staff recommends that the Applicants file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum. Finally, Staff recommends that the Applicants use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

### IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Therefore, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	February 24, 2021
Deadline to intervene	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued

### V. CONCLUSION

Staff respectfully recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that the Applicants be directed to provide notice as detailed in the attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted.

On December 10, 2020, Markout Water Supply Corporation and the City of Mesquite filed an application for the sale and transfer of facilities and certificate rights in Kaufman county under the provisions of Texas Water Code § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.239.

I reviewed the answers provided to questions 10, 11, 12, and 14 of the application. I did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, I recommend that the Commission deem the application administratively complete from a financial perspective.

Rights in Kaufman County

On December 10, 2020, the City of Mesquite and Markout Water Supply Corporation (Markout WSC) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Kaufman County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.239.

Specifically, the City of Mesquite, certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10060, seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all of the water service area from Markout WSC under water CCN No. 10846. The requested area includes approximately 6,279 acres and 1,081 connections.

Based on the mapping review by Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, the financial and managerial review by Fred Bednarski, Rate Regulation Division, and my technical and managerial review of the additional information filed on January 4, 2021, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete.

The Applicants have requested a waiver of the public notice for this application because they have held meetings with the members of the WSC to discuss the transfer and they do not believe the neighboring utilities will be willing to serve the area. I recommend a waiver of published notice because the area being requested to be transferred is currently certificated; however, I do not recommend a waiver of the public notice. I recommend that the Applicants be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
  - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:

The total requested area includes approximately <u>6.279</u> acres and <u>1.081</u> current customers.

This transaction will have the following effect on the current customers' rates and services: the customers will have a lower rate as the City of Mesquite customers.

The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date. The letter must include the person's name, address, email address and fax number if applicable.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an

evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
