**ORDER NO. 12**  
**LEAVE TO SERVE DISCOVERY**

This Order addresses The Gallery Apartments and Roscoe Property Management's motion for leave to serve discovery, filed on October 4, 2021. In that motion, the Gallery and Roscoe requested leave from the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) to serve discovery on the complainant, Jeff Connors. No objections to this motion were filed.

The ALJ is unaware of any general restriction on the service of discovery under 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.141, or under any other section of the TAC applicable to this docket. While the ALJ may act to curtail abusive or inappropriate use of discovery, 16 TAC § 22.141(a) states that "Parties may obtain discovery regarding any matter, not privileged or exempted under the Texas Rules of Civil Evidence, the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure, or other law or rule, that is relevant to the subject matter in the proceeding." The Gallery and Roscoe are free to serve discovery in this matter, and do not need the leave or permission of the ALJ to do so.
