I spoke with the PUC Mapping Staff, and they provided the attached PDF and following message:

I'm sorry but the shapefiles are the digital data that is viewable and usable only with specially licensed GIS software. Essentially they are how GIS professionals communicate and transfer the boundary information that is contained on the paper maps. In this particular case, they show the portion of the tract the petitioner was asking be considered for release from Aqua Texas Inc (CCN No. 13201).
