COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

On January 20, 2021, Sanctuary Texas, LLC (Sanctuary) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release of approximately 69.113 acres of land within the boundaries of the Aqua Texas, Inc.'s (Aqua Texas) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 13201 in Denton County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Sanctuary asserts that the tract of land is at least 25 acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Denton County, which is a qualifying county. Sanctuary filed supplemental information on February 3, 2021. Aqua Texas filed a motion to intervene on February 5, 2021.

On January 21, 2021, Order No. 1 was filed setting a deadline of February 18, 2021, for the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file comments on the administrative completeness of the petition, the sufficiency of the notice, and to propose a procedural schedule. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Pai Liu in the Commission's Infrastructure Division, Staff recommends that the supplemented petition be found administratively incomplete. Specifically, Staff has noted deficiencies in the mapping content.

II. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On January 20, 2021, Sanctuary Texas, LLC (Sanctuary) filed an application for streamlined expedited release from Aqua Texas. Inc.'s (Aqua Texas) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 13201 in Denton County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Sanctuary asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Denton County, which is a qualifying county.

Sanctuary submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the property was not receiving water service from Aqua Texas and a warranty deed confirming Sanctuary's ownership of the tract of land.

The petition also includes a statement indicating a copy of the petition was sent via certified mail to Aqua Texas on the date the petition was filed with the Commission.

Based on the mapping review by Gary Horton, Infrastructure Division, and my technical and managerial review of the information provided by Sanctuary, I recommend the petition be deemed insufficient for filing and found administratively incomplete.

Mapping Content:

Maps submitted with Interchange Item 1 on January 20, 2021 and Interchange Item 3 on February 3, 20201 are deficient.

Sanctuary must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

- A general location map identifying only the requested area, in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town.
- A detailed map identifying only the requested area, in reference to verifiable man-made

- and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.
- Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); OR metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.
