Pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144, Texas Industrial Energy Consumers ("TIEC") requests that Office of Public Utility Council ("OPUC") provide all of the information requested in Exhibit "A" within the time frame specified under the procedural schedule set in this proceeding.

Pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144(c)(2), TIEC further requests that answers to the requests for information be made under oath. Each answer should identify the person responsible for preparing that answer (other than the purely clerical aspects of its preparation) and the name of the witness in this proceeding who will sponsor the answer and who can vouch for its accuracy. In producing documents pursuant to this request for information, please indicate the specific request(s) to which the document is being produced. These requests are continuing in nature, and should there be, for any reason, a change in circumstances which would modify or change an answer supplied by you, such changed answer should be submitted immediately as a supplement to your original answer pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144(i). Please answer each request and sub-request in the order in which they are listed and in sufficient detail to provide a complete and accurate answer to the request. TIEC further requests that each item of information be made available as it is completed, rather than upon compilation of all information requested.

All information responsive to the requests on the attached Exhibit "A" should be sent to the following persons via overnight courier, on a piecemeal basis as individual items become available:

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DEFINITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

- A. "SPS" or "the Company" refers to Southwestern Public Service Company, and its parent (Xcel Energy), affiliates, subsidiaries, and any person acting or purporting to act on their behalf, including without limitation, attorneys, agents, advisors, investigators, representatives, employees or other persons. This definition is not intended to extend an RFI to encompass attorney work product.

 - D. "BTM" means behind-the-meter.
- E. "Xcel Energy" refers to Xcel Energy, Inc., and its affiliates, subsidiaries, and any person acting or purporting to act on their behalf, including without limitation, attorneys, agents, advisors, investigators, representatives, employees or other persons. This definition is not intended to extend an RFI to encompass attorney work product.
- F. The terms "document" or "documents" are used in their broadest sense to include, by way of illustration and not limitation, all written or graphic matter of every kind and description whether printed, produced, reproduced or stored by any process whether visually, magnetically, mechanically, electronically or by hand, whether final or draft, original or reproduction, whether or not claimed to be privileged or otherwise excludable from discovery, and whether or not in your actual or constructive possession, custody, or control. The terms include writings, correspondence, telegrams, memoranda, studies, reports, surveys, statistical compilations, notes, calendars, tapes, computer disks, data on computer drives, e-mail, cards, recordings, contracts, agreements, invoices, licenses, diaries, journals, accounts, pamphlets, books, ledgers, publications, microfilm, microfiche and any other data compilations from which information can be obtained and

The term "concerning," or one of its inflections, includes the following meanings: relating to; referring to; pertaining to; regarding; discussing; mentioning; containing; reflecting; evidencing; describing; showing; identifying; providing; disproving; consisting of; supporting; contradicting; in any way legally, logically or factually connected with the matter to which the term refers; or having a tendency to prove or disprove the matter to which the term refers.
- L. The term "including," or one of its inflections, means and refers to "including but not limited to."
- M. Words used in the plural shall also be taken to mean and include the singular. Words used in the singular shall also be taken to mean and include the plural.
- N. The present tense shall be construed to include the past tense, and the past tense shall be construed to include the present tense.
- O. If any document is withheld under any claims of privilege, please furnish a list identifying each document for which a privileges is claimed together with the following information: date, sender, recipients of copies, subject matter of the document, and the basis upon which such privilege is claimed. This instruction is not intended to impose an obligation greater than contemplated by the Commission's rules and any applicable orders in this case.

- b. Does Mr. Evans assert that the losses incurred by SPS to deliver power and energy by voltage level must be the same as or comparable to the losses incurred to deliver power and energy by other utilities? If so, please provide all bases for this assertion.

TIEC 1-2 Referring to Attachment EDE-7

- a. Please identify all utilities that have similar demand and energy loss factors to deliver power and energy at primary and secondary voltage to the loss factors that Mr. Evans is recommending.
- b. Please explain how an error in SPS's overall energy loss factor would affect the demand loss factors.
- c. Please provide all bases upon which Mr. Evans relies for making a proportional adjustment to both the demand and energy loss factors by voltage level to correct for the asserted error in SPS's overall energy losses.
- TIEC 1-3 Referring to Attachment EDE-8, please provide any analysis concerning the impact of WTI oil prices on the amount of energy sold by SPS.
- Are the Hale and Sagamore wind plants energy-only resources or do these plants also provide capacity? Please explain your response.
- TIEC 1-5 Please explain how, if at all, Hale and Sagamore are different from the wind projects with which SPS has purchased power agreements.
- Are SPS's wind purchased power agreements energy-only resources or do they also provide capacity? Please explain your response.
- TIEC 1-7 Referring to page 44 of Mr. Evans' rate design direct testimony:

- a. Define Mr. Evans' definition of "extreme rate changes." How does the definition of extreme rate change vary with each customer class?
- b. Did Mr. Evans make any other comparisons between the test year and other years? If so, please provide the comparisons.
- c. What usage characteristics and other circumstances does Mr. Evans believe are expected to prevail during the period new rates are in effect. How would these characteristics differ from the corresponding 2020 characteristics?
- d. Has Mr. Evans conducted a class cost-of-service study based on the usage characteristics usage characteristics and other circumstances Mr. Evans believes are expected to prevail during the period new rates are in effect? If so, provide a copy of this study.
- e. Does Mr. Evans believe that the class rates of return derived in SPS's class cost-of-service study are inaccurate or unrepresentative? If so, please explain the basis for his belief and provide any analysis conducted or relied upon by Mr. Evans demonstrating the impact on class rates of return of using 2020 usage characteristics versus the usage characteristics in other time periods.
- f. Please define what Mr. Evans means by "drastic moves toward system average rates of return."
