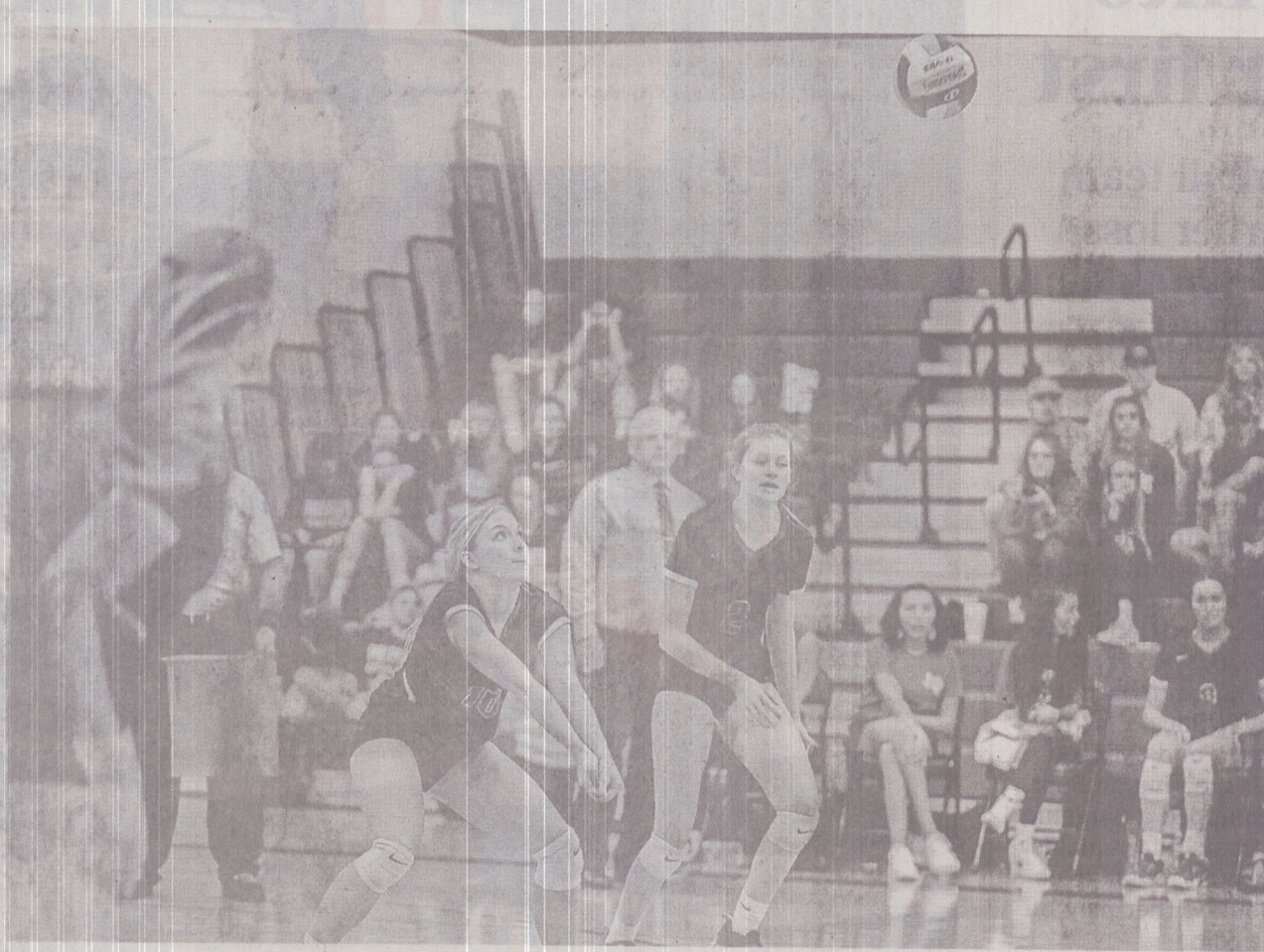

But a 73-yard return of the ensuing kickoff by Xavionte Jackson set up MHS nicely, and with 30 seconds left in the half, wide receiver Bates took a pitch and threw it to Benson for an 18-yard scoring play. The point-after by Tyson Williams sent the Panthers into halftime on top, 19-7.

The second half was a defensive battle, but the Panthers were still able to widen the winning gap. Williams kicked a 25-yard field goal late in the third quarter, and a Centennial fumble at its own 41 set up Richburg's 5-yard touchdown run to close out the night.

The Panthers will travel to rival Red Oak on Friday for another key district contest. The Hawks (1-5, 1-2) are coming off a 48-21 loss to Colleyville Heritage. Kickoff at Billy Goodloe Stadium is set for 7 p.m.

"I'm just trying to keep going and get as many yards as I can to help my teammates and help us reach our potential," said Anderson, who scored on a 2-yard run just before halftime. "Even though we lost tonight, we played with heart and we improved this week."

Another good sign for Brownwood was touchdown passes of 37 and 54 yards from quarterback Chance Jones to receiver Jason Jackson, who finished with five catches for 99 yards. The Lions had struggled at times this season with their vertical passing game. "I felt pretty good tonight. I was wait-

tripled their pleasure, brooming country rival Emis by identical set scores of 25-13.

Safrit contributed seven kills and 11 digs, and Armstrong also contributed seven kills.

McMichael added 18 digs and three aces, Rector had 22 assists and Garay had 14 assists for the Lady Panthers.

Before the third quarter ended, O'Neal had popped his 30-yard scoring run as the Jaguars' lead grew to 36-13.

"Even though we didn't win, we played with great passion and effort, and we played a lot more physical," Burnett said. "We wanted to make them earn everything they got tonight. We just gave up too many big plays."

"Chance Jones played through a thumb injury tonight, and we would have been in a bind without him. And

Quentin Thompson came from the safety position and made some big hits. He really grew up tonight."

The Lions, who fell behind 22-0 in the second quarter, fought back into contention with an 11-play, 71-yard drive that included five carries for 43 yards by Anderson. The junior back scored the touchdown on a direct-snap, 2-yard run as Brownwood pulled within 22-7 with 18 seconds left before halftime.

Heritage controlled much of the first half with its big plays. A 73-yard screen pass from Brown to Barcola set up Brown's 2-yard touchdown run that staked the Jaguars to a 7-0 lead with 5:44 left in the first quarter.

Brown scored his second rushing touchdown on a 67-yard sprint that extended the Jaguars' lead to 14-0 with 7:39 left in the second quarter. After Heritage recovered a Brownwood fumble at the Lions' 33-yard line, Brown immediately threw deep for a 33-yard touchdown pass to Pride as the Jaguars increased their lead to 22-0 with 6:42 left before halftime.

The City of Midlothian has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11706 and to decertify a portion of Mountain Peak Special Utility District’s water CCN No. 10908 for the provision of retail water utility service in Ellis County, Texas.

The requested area includes 201 customer connections, is located approximately 1.5 miles south-southeast of downtown Midlothian, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by Mt. Zion Road; on the east by Oak Tree Lane; on the south by SCS Reservoir No. 5; and on the west by S 14th Street.

The requested area includes approximately 53 acres, comprised of 41 acres of uncertificated area; and 12 acres of decertified area (from CCN No. 10908).

The application proposes the addition of approximately 53 acres to CCN No. 11706.
The application proposes the subtraction of approximately 12 acres from CCN No. 10908.

See enclosed map showing the requested area.

Persons who wish to intervene in the proceeding or comment upon action sought should contact the Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 13326, Austin, Texas 78711-3326, or call the Public Utility Commission at (512) 936-7120 or (888) 782-8477. Hearing- and speech-impaired individuals with text telephones (TTY) may contact the commission at (512) 936-7136. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date. The letter must include the person’s name, address, email address and fax number if applicable.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area (“opt out”) within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner’s tract of land, landowner’s name, address, email address and fax number, if applicable.
