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When there is a problem with the sewer plant/tanks, who is supposed to be overlooking this, checking on them, doing inspections to make sure they stay in compliance? I spoke to County Commissioner about this when I heard there was a problem and the response I got back was, I was told everything was good.

Should the "enlargement" be applied for before new subdivisions are approved or can new subdivisions be approved and then added to the sewer plant? Again, who oversee this? If the sewer plant is not big enough to handle this, how can a subdivision be approved using this sewer plant?

How is my property that is located in the map that is with this publication going to be affected if I don't do anything or if I dispute this?

When the plant was originally installed, what was the reason behind it? What subdivision was it going to be taking care of? What is the reason for needing to enlarge the tanks and why do they need 405 acres to do so?

Again, when there is a problem with it, who oversees that? Who inspects it to make sure it stays legal, whatever legal means for a sewer plant?

Should Medina County have some "official" health inspector or someone who is legally responsible for overseeing all of this?

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to ask questions and hopefully, I can get answers before any deadline.
