COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

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On March 25, 2021, NPH Market Street, LLC (NPH) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Gulf Coast Authority's (Gulf Coast) sewer certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 20465 in Chambers County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h).

On April 27, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 2, requiring the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file a recommendation on final disposition on or before June 1, 2021. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Patricia Garcia, Infrastructure Division, Staff has reviewed the petition for streamlined expedited release and recommends that it be approved. Staff respectfully requests the issuance of an order consistent with this recommendation.

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends that NPH's petition be approved and that the ALJ issue an order consistent with this recommendation.


On March 25, 2021, NPH Market Street, LLC (NPH) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Gulf Coast Authority's (Gulf Coast) sewer certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 20465 in Chambers County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). NPH asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving sewer service, and is located in Chambers County, which is a qualifying county.

NPH submitted adequate maps delineating the requested area for expedited release with enough detail to confirm the accurate positioning of its digital data under 16 TAC § 24.245(k). The map and digital data are sufficient for determining the location of the requested release area within Gulf Coast's certificated area. Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, was able to confirm the acreage of the subject property and determined that the requested area is located within Gulf Coast's sewer CCN. Furthermore, NPH provided a warranty deed confirming ownership of the tract of land within Gulf Coast's certificated area. In addition, NPH submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the property was not receiving sewer service from the CCN holder. The total property is approximately 134.09 acres. The requested area to be released from Gulf Coast's CCN No. 20465 is approximately 134.09 acres.

Gulf Coast did not request to intervene.

In accordance with TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), NPH has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the release of the requested area from Gulf Coast's CCN No. 20465. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Additionally, I recommend that the final map and certificate be provided to the CCN holder.
