ORDER NO. 3
REQUESTING CLARIFICATION OF FILING

This Order addresses the need for clarification regarding the June 28, 2021 filing of Brock Rhodes. It is unclear from the filing if the filer wishes to intervene or protest in the proceeding. The filing description indicates a protest, but the PDF filed is entitled ‘Request to Intervene.’

By the end of the intervention period, which is 30 days after Monarch Utilities I, L.P. issues notice, the filer must file a clarification indicating whether they intend to protest or intervene. If the filer intends to intervene, they must file a motion to intervene compliant with 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.104. The administrative law judge encourages the filer to confer with Commission Staff as to the difference, and responsibilities of, a protest versus a motion to intervene.

In future correspondence with the Commission about this case, please refer to Docket No. 52035. Unless otherwise specified, an original and ten copies of documents relating to this proceeding must be filed with the Commission’s filing clerk in accordance with 16 TAC § 22.71. **In light of the Commission’s Second Order regarding the COVID-19 pandemic entered in Docket No. 50664, this requirement will be considered satisfied if pleadings are filed with the Commission through the Interchange on the Commission’s website as long as the Commission’s Second Order is in effect.**^[1]

Service of pleadings is typically governed by 16 TAC § 22.74. However, as long as the Commission’s Second Order remains in effect, all parties must file any pleading or document with the Commission solely through the Interchange on the Commission’s website and provide notice, by email, to all other parties that the pleading or document has been filed with the Commission, unless otherwise ordered by the presiding officer. It will be incumbent
